- JUDGE STEARLEY: Good morning. Today is
- 3 Tuesday, September 20, 2011. The Commission has set this
- 4 time for a prehearing conference in File No. EC-2011-0326,
- 5 captioned as Eric E. Vickers versus Union Electric, doing
- 6 business as Ameren Missouri.
- 7 My name is Harold Stearley, and I am the
- 8 regulatory law judge presiding over this matter. And we'll
- 9 begin by taking entries of appearance, starting with Ameren
- 10 Missouri.
- 11 MS. GIBONEY: Sarah Giboney, Ameren
- 12 Missouri, 200 South Ninth Street, Columbia, Missouri 65201.
- MR. VICKERS: I'm sorry. I couldn't hear.
- 14 MS. GIBONEY: Sarah Giboney, Ameren
- 15 Missouri.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. And,
- 17 Mr. Vickers, if you'd enter your appearance, please.
- 18 MR. VICKERS: Yeah. This is Eric Vickers on
- 19 behalf of Eric Vickers.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Thank you,
- 21 Mr. Vickers. Staff of the Missouri Public Service
- 22 Commission?
- 23 MR. THOMPSON: Thank you, Judge. Kevin A.
- 24 Thompson, for the Staff of the Missouri Public Service
- Commission, Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri

- 1 65102.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Thank you,
- 3 Mr. Thompson. And for the Office of the Public Counsel?
- 4 MR. MILLS: Lewis Mills. My address is Post
- 5 Office Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- 6 JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Are there any
- 7 preliminary matters we need to take up at all? Okay.
- 8 Well, basically, we set this conference because we have an
- 9 evidentiary hearing scheduled now for the 31st of October.
- 10 And I briefly wanted to run through what the procedure --
- 11 the way it normally plays out here at the Commission, for
- 12 Mr. Vickers' benefit.
- 13 Mr. Vickers, since you are appearing pro se,
- 14 usually what we do is -- and you're the complainant -- is
- 15 you will go first. And you will be sworn in and you can
- 16 offer your testimony. You don't have to be in that awkward
- 17 role of asking yourself questions, just tell us what your
- 18 case is.
- 19 We'll have a round of cross-examination. If
- 20 the Commissioners are in attendance and -- or myself --
- 21 have questions for you, we will ask them after the first
- 22 round of cross-examination. And then there will be a round
- of recross. Following which, you'll be allowed to do a
- 24 redirect, or rebuttal or response, to the cross and all the
- other questions that may have been asked.

- 1 If need be, we can do multiple rounds of
- 2 recross and redirect, if there's issues that pop up that
- 3 need to be addressed. So pretty straightforward procedure,
- 4 but I wasn't sure how familiar you might be with the
- 5 Commission's proceedings here, Mr. Vickers.
- I did order that the parties should appear
- 7 in person here at the Commission. We have allowed pro se
- 8 complainants to appear by phone, but sometimes that can be
- 9 awkward, and we've had problems with phone connections, et
- 10 cetera, so it is really better that you appear in person.
- 11 Does anyone have any questions for me, or would like to add
- 12 any comments?
- 13 MR. THOMPSON: Are we going to get a list of
- 14 witnesses before the hearing, Judge?
- 15 JUDGE STEARLEY: Mr. Vickers, do you have
- any witnesses that you plan on bringing?
- 17 MR. VICKERS: No, I do not.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. I guess Staff
- 19 and Public Counsel and Ameren could file a witness list --
- MS. GIBONEY: We can do that.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: -- in EFIS.
- MR. THOMPSON: Sure.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Let's see. We're
- 24 September 20th. Let's say no later than October 17th.
- MR. THOMPSON: All right.

- 1 JUDGE STEARLEY: I don't have a calendar in
- 2 front of me, so I'm not sure what day of the week that is.
- MS. GIBONEY: That's a Monday.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay.
- 5 MR. LEWIS: That's two weeks before the
- 6 hearing.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Anything else?
- 8 MR. THOMPSON: No, sir.
- 9 MS. GIBONEY: No, sir.
- 10 JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Well,
- 11 Mr. Vickers, I am going to conclude the on-the-record
- 12 portion of this prehearing conference. You're welcome to
- 13 stay on the phone, and the parties are all present if you
- 14 wish to have any discussions about the case, possible
- 15 settlement, or anything else that you wish to discuss. I'll
- leave the phone line open here.
- 17 If you-all wish to conclude -- you've got
- 18 the room here for as long as you need it. I don't believe
- anybody else has scheduled anything for 305 immediately.
- Some of the parties present in the room may
- 21 need to go to the Commission's agenda session though. I'm
- 22 not sure if any of you do or not. But that's scheduled for
- 23 9:30, so --
- 24 MR. VICKERS: I just wanted to confirm the
- 25 date and time for the evidentiary hearing.

- 1 JUDGE STEARLEY: Certainly. It's
- October 31st. We're going to start at 1:00 p.m. in the
- 3 afternoon, and it will be at Room 310 in the Governor's
- 4 Office Building. And when you walk in this building,
- 5 Mr. Vickers, street level is the third floor, so don't let
- 6 that confuse you. You'll already be on the third floor.
- 7 Entrance to the hearing room, 310, will be on your left as
- 8 you come through the doors on the front of the building.
- 9 MR. VICKERS: Is that the Capitol building?
- 10 JUDGE STEARLEY: No. It is located at
- 11 200 Madison Street, which is the corner of Madison and
- 12 Capitol.
- MR. VICKERS: Oh, okay.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: It's across the street, to
- 15 the east, from the city parking garage, and to the north is
- 16 the Governor's Mansion, right across the street from that
- 17 as well.
- I am assuming that we could conclude this in
- 19 half a day, but if we do need additional time, I have
- 20 reserved November 1st, the following day, if we need to go
- 21 over into a second day.
- 22 MR. VICKERS: I think we can conclude it
- 23 that day.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. All right. Any
- other questions the parties have for me?

1	MR. THOMPSON: No, sir.
2	JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Well, with
3	that, we'll conclude the on-the-record portion of this
4	conference. And if you-all wish to have any further
5	discussions, you're certainly free to.
