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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	JUDGE BUSHMANN: We're on the record.
3	Today is Wednesday, August 29th, 2012 at
4	two o'clock p.m. The Commission has set this time for a
5	prehearing conference in File No. EC-2012-0406, which is
6	captioned as Sherry Veach, Plaintiff, versus the Empire
7	District Electric Company.
8	My name is Michael Bushmann. I'm the
9	regulatory law judge who has been assigned to this
10	matter.
11	Let's start by taking entries of appearance.
12	Ms. Veach, am I correct that you'll be
13	representing yourself in this matter?
14	MS. VEACH: Yes.
15	JUDGE BUSHMANN: And attorneys for Empire
16	District Electric Company.
17	MS. CARTER: Diana Carter with Brydon,
18	Swearengen & England, and the court reporter has my
19	address on the written entry.
20	JUDGE BUSHMANN: Thank you, Ms. Carter.
21	For Staff of the Commission.
22	MS. MOORE: Amy Moore and Nathan Williams.
23	We also gave our address to the court reporter.
24	JUDGE BUSHMANN: And I don't see anybody
25	present for Public Counsel.

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1	Are there any preliminary matters that we
2	need to take up at this time?
3	MS. CARTER: Not that I'm aware of.
4	JUDGE BUSHMANN: Well, the purpose of a
5	prehearing conference is primarily for the parties to
6	get together and talk about settlement before we go
7	or after we go off the record.
8	And I know in this case that there was a
9	requirement that the parties file a proposed procedural
10	schedule no later than September 6th, and in thinking
11	about that, it seems to me that if settlement is being
12	talked about and is proceeding and there is being some
13	progress made, that you just need more time to talk,
14	then I think it would be best if you filed a joint
15	status report by the 6th.
16	But, however, if settlement isn't going
1,7	anywhere and there's no progress being made, then I
18	would prefer that you go ahead and make that filing a
19	joint procedural schedule.
20	This is a small formal complaint case, so
21	there won't be a requirement that there be any prefiled
22	testimony.
23	However, if you do go ahead and file the
24	joint proposed procedural schedule on the 6th, there's a
25	couple of things that I would like you to do.

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1	Did someone just enter the conference?
2	(OFF THE RECORD.)
3	JUDGE BUSHMANN: Okay. I think I was talking
4	about the procedural schedule.
5	There is some things that I wanted you to
6	include in there even though it is a small relatively
7	informal case, and that would be a date for conclusion
8	of discovery, a date for the filing of the joint
9	stipulation of nondisputed material facts, a list of
10	issues and witnesses, proposed hearing date and then a
11	date for optional post-hearing briefs.
12	Ms. Veach, did you understand the stuff that
13	I've just been talking about? Do you have any questions
14	about any of that?
15	MS. VEACH: I'd like you to go through it and
16	explain everything as far as what is included and why
17	you know, this is the first time I've ever been
18	JUDGE BUSHMANN: Okay. Let me try and
19	explain.
20	MS. VEACH: And do you mind if I record it?
21	JUDGE BUSHMANN: Well, it's being
22	transcribed.
23	MS. VEACH: Okay. As long as it's
24	transcribed.
25	JUDGE BUSHMANN: We will have a copy that

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1	would be provided to you.
2	MS. VEACH: Okay. That will work.
3	JUDGE BUSHMANN: So what I've just been
4	talking about is the requirement of some preliminary
5	filings.
6	MS. VEACH: Right.
7	JUDGE BUSHMANN: And since there's a
8	possibility that the since the parties might be
9	talking about settlement after we go off the record, one
10	of those filings might be a joint status report.
11	These joint filings that I'm talking about
12	would be filed by Staff. They'd be on behalf of all of
13	the parties.
14	MS. VEACH: Okay.
15	JUDGE BUSHMANN: So they would be things that
16	you would be discussing later after I leave
17	MS. VEACH: Okay.
18	JUDGE BUSHMANN: with the other parties.
19	And one of those might be a status report,
20	just to say that we're talking and need more time. The
21	other thing is called a procedural schedule. That will
22	be the thing that it's basically a roadmap to how the
23	rest of the case is going to proceed if it looks like
24	there is going to be a hearing
25	MS. VEACH: Okay.

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1	JUDGE BUSHMANN: and it sets out certain			
2	dates and events when certain things have to be done.			
3	MS. VEACH: Okay.			
4	JUDGE BUSHMANN: So that's what I mean when I			
5	say procedural schedule.			
6	MS. VEACH: Okay.			
7	JUDGE BUSHMANN: And what I just described to			
8	the attorneys was certain standard things that are			
9	normally in a procedural schedule. This one has less			
10	than normal because it's a much less formal case.			
11	MS. VEACH: Okay.			
12	JUDGE BUSHMANN: But there are certain			
13	things, certain dates that I want to get set so that we			
14	all know what's going to happen before we get to a			
15	hearing.			
16	MS. VEACH: Okay.			
17	JUDGE BUSHMANN: And you will be talking with			
18	the attorneys after I leave and trying to come up with			
19	mutually agreeable dates for this.			
20	MS. VEACH: Okay.			
21	JUDGE BUSHMANN: Does that answer your			
22	question?			
23	MS. VEACH: Yes. Yes.			
24	JUDGE BUSHMANN: Now, since this is a small			
25	formal complaint, the rule about small formal complaints			

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1	says that unless the parties agree otherwise, the
2	hearing is supposed to be held in the county where the
3	service was rendered.
4	I'm not familiar with Fair Grove, Missouri.
5	Could you tell me where that's located?
6	MS. VEACH: You go down 65, and from
7	Springfield you head north. It's 15 miles north of
8	Springfield on 65.
9	JUDGE BUSHMANN: What county is that?
10	MS. VEACH: It's Greene. And we do have a
11	courtroom there in City Hall.
12	JUDGE BUSHMANN: In Fair Grove?
13	MS. VEACH: Yes.
14	JUDGE BUSHMANN: And if it looks like we're
15	heading that direction as far as having a hearing. I'll
16	remind that the rule does say that parties and witnesses
17	and attorneys can make a request to appear by telephone
18	since it's a less formal hearing.
19	Is there anything else that I need to address
20	before I go off the record? Anything else that anybody
21	needs to bring up?
22	Okay. In that case we're off the record.
