## ORDER APPROVING TARIFF TO ADJUST RATE SCHEDULES FOR FUEL ADJUSTMENT CLAUSE

Issue Date: August 12, 2009 Effective Date: August 22, 2009

On July 1, 2009, KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (GMO) submitted a tariff to adjust rate schedules related to GMO's Fuel Adjustment Clause (FAC). That tariff carries an effective date of September 1, 2009.

The Commission's rule regarding FACs requires the Commission issue an order approving or rejecting the company's tariff within 60 days of its filing. To that end, the rule requires the Commission's Staff to submit a recommendation within 30 days indicating whether the proposed FAC tariff complies with applicable statues, regulations, and the company's FAC mechanism. On July 31, 2009, Staff filed its recommendation indicating GMO's tariff complies with the Commission's order that established the company's FAC and with applicable Commission rules. Staff advises the Commission to approve GMO's tariff as an interim rate adjustment, subject to true-up and prudence reviews.
