ORDER DIRECTING RESPONSE

On November 18, 2009, the City of Campbell, Missouri, filed a motion to stay proceedings in this case. In support of its motion, the City relates that its City Council has voted to approve a bid by Ozark Border Electric Cooperative to purchase the City's electrical service system. The City anticipates that it and Ozark Border will sign a contract for sale and purchase of distribution facilities by the end of November 2009, and that the City will conduct an election in February 2010 in which its residents will vote whether to approve that contract. If the contract is approved, the City will transfer its electrical system to Ozark Border in 2010 and the Applicants will become customers of Ozark Border as they request in their application.

The Commission will direct the Applicants to state whether they wish to continue the prosecution of their case or whether they agree to postponing the proceedings until after the February 2010 municipal election, when it will be known whether the sale of the City's facilities has been approved. If the sale is approved, Applicants will become customers of Ozark Border without a need to pursue their application. If the sale is not approved, proceedings in this application would resume.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Thomas and Tammy McCoin shall notify the Commission in writing no later than December 7, 2009, whether they agree to a stay of proceedings until after the municipal election noted above is held, or whether they wish to continue prosecution of their case.
 - 2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
