ORDER SUSPENDING THE EVIDENTIARY HEARING AND DIRECTING FILING

Issue Date: March 29, 2021

Effective Date: March 29, 2021

This Complaint was set for an evidentiary hearing on April 1, 2021. On March 24, 2021, the Commission dispensed with prefiled direct testimony and ordered that the parties present their cases live at the evidentiary hearing. Respondents filed a motion asking the Commission to reconsider its order dispensing with direct testimony on March 25, 2021. That same day the parties filed their Joint List of Issues, Order of Opening, Witnesses and Cross Examination, in which the identity of Complainants' witness was first disclosed.

Respondents' motion asserts that requiring live testimony with little more than a week's notice, involving a witness that was just identified, and with no opportunity to issue discovery, is a violation of their due process rights. Respondents state that they had no prior notice of Complainants' witness identity, no notice of the arguments and analysis allegedly in support of the Complaint, and no opportunity to issue discovery or take a deposition.

Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.130(9) provides that in any case, the Commission may direct that testimony be taken live rather than prepared in advance. The Commission will hold an evidentiary hearing where the parties will present their cases to the Commission live. However, the identity of Complainants' witness in this case was first disclosed on March 25, 2021, giving Respondent little time to prepare for that witness. Therefore, so that Respondent has time to sufficiently prepare for the evidentiary hearing, the Commission will suspend the current April 1, 2021 evidentiary hearing, and order the parties to submit a new evidentiary hearing date for the Commission's consideration.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The evidentiary hearing set for April 1, 2021, is suspended until further order of the Commission.

2. No later than April 2, 2021, the parties shall jointly file a pleading proposing a new date for an evidentiary hearing to be held prior to May 23, 2021.

3. This order is effective when issued.
