ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

Issue Date: August 4, 2015

Effective Date: August 4, 2015

Monty Scroggins' complaint¹ charges that KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations ("GMO") has violated the law governing solar rebates. GMO filed a motion to dismiss for lack of prosecution² ("motion") under the Commission's regulations:

Cases may be dismissed for lack of prosecution if no action has occurred in the case for ninety (90) days and no party has filed a pleading requesting a continuance beyond that time. [³]

The motion cites the absence of any filing since the joint proposed procedural schedule more than 90 days ago.⁴ That schedule proposed filing dates, which the Commission ordered,⁵ that have passed without compliance.

If Monty Scroggins does not respond to the motion, the Commission may grant the motion. If the Commission grants the motion, the Commission will dismiss the complaint. Dismissal means that the Commission will close this file without deciding whether Monty Scroggins was right or wrong about his complaint.

Before the Commission rules on the motion, the Commission will consider a response showing cause why the Commission should not dismiss the complaint, and will set a deadline for that response.⁶

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. No later than August 14, 2015, Monty Scroggins shall file a response to this order showing why the Commission should not dismiss the complaint for lack of prosecution.
2. This order is effective immediately upon issuance.
