ORDER GRANTING THE DIVISION OF ENERGY'S APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

The Commission's Staff filed a complaint against KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (GMO) on July 13, 2015, alleging that GMO has failed to comply with a provision of the Commission's rules designed to implement the Missouri Energy Efficiency Investment Act (MEEIA). On August 5, the Missouri Department of Economic Development – Division of Energy, a state agency interested in energy related issues, including MEEIA, applied to intervene. More than ten days have passed since the Division of Energy applied to intervene and no party has objected to that application.

The Commission finds that the Division of Energy's interest in this case is different from that of the general public, and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Further, the Commission finds that allowing the Division of Energy to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(3), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Application to Intervene of the Missouri Department of Economic Development – Division of Energy is granted.
2. This order shall be effective when issued.
