**ORDER GRANTING MOTION**

On May 12, 2006, Barnes-Jewish Hospital, River Cement Company and SSM Healthcare ("Missouri Energy Group") filed an application to intervene. On May 23, 2006, Missouri Energy Group filed a Motion to Amend its Application to Intervene. In its original application, River Cement Company should have read Buzzi Unicem USA, Inc., the correct corporate name for the successor to the former River Cement Company. In addition, Holcim US, Inc. was omitted from the original application.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075 governs intervention before the Commission. That rule states that the Commission may allow a party to intervene if the proposed intervenor has an interest which is different from that of the general public and which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case, or granting the proposed intervention would serve the public interest. Considering no objections have been made to Missouri Energy Group's Motion to Amend its Application to Intervene, the Commission finds that the proposed interveners either have an interest which is different from that of the general public and which may be adversely affected by a final

order arising from the case, or that granting the proposed interventions would serve the public interest. Therefore, the Commission will grant Missouri Energy Group's Motion.

**IT IS ORDERED THAT:**

1. The motion to amend its application to intervene filed by Missouri Energy Group, is granted.
2. This order shall become effective on June 29, 2006.
