ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME TO RESPOND

Kansas City Power & Light Company has filed its Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) pursuant to Chapter 22 of the Commission's rules. On November 15, 2006, the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, the Office of the Public Counsel, and the Commission's Staff filed comments regarding KCPL's IRP, noting deficiencies in that plan. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-22.080(8) provides that the parties are to work together to reach a joint agreement to remedy the deficiencies. If the parties are able to reach an agreement, it is to be filed within 45 days of the date comments were submitted. In this case, such agreement was to be filed on December 30.

The parties have not yet reached an agreement, and instead, on December 27, KCPL filed a motion requesting that the time for filing such an agreement be extended until February 13, 2007. KCPL explained that the parties have continued to work on an agreement that would address all noted deficiencies. But, due to the press of other matters, they have not yet been able to finalize their agreement. No other party has responded to KCPL's motion.

Section 12 of 4 CSR 240-22.080 provides that the Commission may extend or reduce any of the time periods specified in the rule for good cause shown. The Commission finds that KCPL has shown good cause for extending the time for filing an agreement. The requested extension of time will be granted.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- Kansas City Power & Light Company's Application for Extension of Time is granted.
- 2. The deadline for the submission of a joint agreement on a plan to remedy the deficiencies noted in Kansas City Power & Light Company's Integrated Resource Plan is extended until February 13, 2007.
 - 3. This order shall become effective on January 8, 2007.
