WILLIAMS: Judge, Nathan Williams, for 14 15 public counsel. Judge, we're amenable to status reports to keep things from languishing, and 16 17 we're also willing to work with the other 18 parties towards a schedule. 19 MR. KEEVIL: Yeah, we would be, too, Judge. 20 This is Keevil. One question: I don't remember 21 if there is any further procedural schedule 22 ordered after this prehearing conference.
