**NOTICE OF COMPLAINT, ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME TO RESPOND
AND ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME TO APPLY TO INTERVENE**

Issue Date: February 2, 2016

Effective Date February 2, 2016

On February 1, 2016, the Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers (MIEC) and 32 other individual customers of Ameren Missouri filed a complaint with the Missouri Public Service Commission against Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri, asking that Ameren Missouri's rate structure be redesigned to reduce rates for Noranda. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.070(8) provides that a respondent is to file an answer to a complaint within 30 days unless the Commission establishes some other time for response. The Complainants request expedited consideration of their complaint, so the Commission will direct Ameren Missouri to file its answer no later than February 9.

Since this complaint will likely draw the interest of potential intervenors, the Commission will also establish a date for the filing of applications to intervene. That date will be set the same day Ameren Missouri's answer is due.

As required by Section 536.067(2)(f), RSMo 2000, the Commission informs the parties that the Commission's provisions governing procedures before the Commission, including provisions relating to discovery, are found at Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.090.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

3. Any party wishing to intervene in this case shall apply to intervene no later than February 9, 2016.

4. Any person or entity wishing to respond to any application to intervene shall do so no later than February 11, 2016.
