ORDER GRANTING PETITION FOR LEAVE TO FILE AMICUS CURIAE BRIEF

Issue Date: February 8, 2017 Effective Date: February 8, 2017

On January 31, 2017, the *Petition of Spire Inc. for Leave to File Amicus Curiae Brief* was filed. Concurrent with its Petition, Spire Inc. also submitted its *amicus curiae* brief. The Commission issued an order setting a February 3, 2017 deadline for parties to file objections to Spire Inc.'s Petition. On February 4, Midwest Energy Consumers Group (MECG) submitted its *Objection to Amicus Brief and Motion to Late File*. MECG states that due to its counsel's preparation for the KCPL rate case, the Objection was filed one day after the filing deadline. Finding the stated reason for the delay to be reasonable, the Commission will grant the Motion and consider MECG's Objection.

Spire Inc. is not a party in this complaint case. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(11) permits any person that is not a party to seek leave to file an *amicus curiae*, i.e., "friend of the court" brief. The petitioner must state their interest in the matter, explain why the brief is desirable, and state how the matters asserted in the brief are relevant to a determination in the case.

Spire Inc. f.k.a. The Laclede Group, Inc. is a Missouri based holding company that is subject to an agreement with a provision similar to the one at issue in this case. Spire Inc. has established an interest in this matter due to its comparable experiences as a holding company that is a parent company of regulated and foreign utilities. Spire Inc. states that it is in a unique position to provide a legal perspective and background information relevant to the Commission's consideration in this case.

MECG's argument that Spire Inc. does not limit itself to the three issues identified by the parties or to the facts accepted into the record is not persuasive. Spire Inc.'s brief does not ask the Commission to determine issues beyond the three identified by the parties. While an *amicus curiae* should not inject new issues into a case, courts normally permit an *amicus curiae* brief that demonstrates facts or questions of law at issue may not be adequately presented by the parties.¹ Spire Inc.'s brief addresses relevant questions of law, such as potential legal implications from the Commission's prior disclaiming of jurisdiction in circumstances similar to the one at issue in this case and the potential for discriminatory regulatory treatment based on the location of parent companies.

For these reasons, the Commission finds that Spire Inc. has complied with the requirements of Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(11) and will grant the company's Petition.

- 1. MECG's Motion to Late File is granted.
- 2. The Petition of Spire Inc. for Leave to File Amicus Curiae Brief is granted

and the company's amicus curiae brief is deemed filed on January 31, 2017.
