## ORDER REGARDING TAX REVENUE IMPACT INFORMATION

Issue Date: March 26, 2012

Effective Date: March 26, 2012

The Missouri Public Service Commission is directing the Data Center to send the applications to any clerk of an affected county<sup>1</sup> in accordance with the list that applicants filed in compliance with the Commission's order.<sup>2</sup>

The information is required by statute:

Any person seeking any order under this subsection authorizing the [transaction described in the application] shall, at the time of application for any such order, file with the commission a statement, [of] any, impact such [transaction] will have on the tax revenues of the political subdivisions in which any [assets described in the application] are located. The commission shall send a copy of all information obtained by it as to what . . . impact such [transaction] will have on the tax revenues of various political subdivisions to the county clerk of each county in which any

portion of a political subdivision which will be affected by such disposition is located.[<sup>3</sup>]

The applicants met the first sentence's requirement in the applications, stating that applicants anticipate no impact, which they reiterate in their list of affected counties.

Nevertheless, the statute requires the Commission to send all information to any clerk of an affected county. All such information currently obtained is in the application.

Therefore, the Commission will send the applications through the Data Center.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The Data Center shall send each application to the clerk of any affected county ("clerk") listed in each applicant's *Response to Order Directing Filing*.

2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
