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- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Good morning. We're on
- 3 the record. This is the prehearing conference in
- 4 Case No. EC2005-0398, Damon Andersson versus Union
- 5 Electric Company, doing business as Ameren UE.
- 6 I'm Ron Pridjin, the regulatory law
- 7 judge assigned to preside over this case. This
- 8 prehearing conference is being held on August 10th,
- 9 2005, and we're in the Governor Office Building, and
- 10 the time is approximately 10:10 a.m.
- 11 We're here because of my August 2nd
- 12 Order setting this case for prehearing conference.
- 13 And what I'd like to do is get entries of appearance
- 14 from counsel, beginning with staff, please.
- MR. DOTTHEIM: Steven Dottheim, Post
- 16 Office Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102,
- 17 appearing on behalf of the staff of the Missouri
- 18 Public Service Commission.
- 19 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Dottheim, thank you.
- 20 On behalf of Ameren UE, please?
- MR. BYRNE: Yes, Judge. I'm Thomas M.
- 22 Byrne. My address is 1901 Chouteau Avenue, St.
- 23 Louis, Missouri 63103.
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Okay, Mr. Byrne, thank
- 25 you.

1 Mr. Andersson, would you please state

- 2 your name and address, sir?
- MR. ANDERSSON: Damon E. Andersson. I
- 4 live at 1 El Perro Drive, St. Peters, Missouri 63376.
- 5 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Andersson, thank
- 6 you, sir.
- 7 Is there anyone here on behalf of the
- 8 Office of Public Counsel?
- 9 (NO RESPONSE.)
- 10 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. I'm seeing
- 11 no response. And Mr. Dottheim, did I understand that
- 12 before we went on the record, you spoke to an
- 13 attorney from OPC, and no counsel intends to be here
- 14 today?
- MR. DOTTHEIM: Yes. I spoke with
- 16 Mr. Douglas Micheel, and he indicated that the Office
- 17 of Public Counsel would not -- would not be in
- 18 attendance today.
- 19 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right, Mr. Dottheim,
- 20 thank you. What I'd like to do is real briefly
- 21 explain why I called you here, and specifically for
- 22 Mr. Andersson, since he's not represented.
- The purpose of this conference is to get
- 24 people together at least once so I know that they've
- 25 at least tried to settle this dispute. And if you're

1 unable to settle, another purpose of this conference

- 2 is to allow you to start discussing when you think
- 3 you'd like to have a hearing. You know, what type of
- 4 preparation you think you'll need, what type of
- 5 preparation the company thinks it might need, et
- 6 cetera.
- 7 And so my purpose here is going to be
- 8 pretty limited. I'm just going to go over a few
- 9 things, and then I'm going to leave the room and
- 10 allow you to -- to talk, basically.
- 11 Mr. Dottheim, something to keep in mind:
- 12 When we start going through a proposed procedural
- 13 schedule, is that I know the Commission sometimes
- 14 prefers not to have prefiled testimony in these pro
- 15 se complaints, so if you get to that, you might want
- 16 to consider submitting alternative schedules, one
- 17 with and one without prefiled, and I can present
- 18 those to the Commission.
- 19 MR. DOTTHEIM: Okay. Very good. And
- 20 Judge, would you like the staff to serve in the usual
- 21 role as far as presenting, if we can reach agreement
- 22 on a procedural schedule if we get to that point,
- 23 have the staff submit a proposed procedural schedule
- 24 that hopefully all the parties have been able to
- 25 agree upon?

- 1 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Yes, sir. Yes, sir,
- 2 please. And just so everyone knows, I mean, you have
- 3 this room for the rest of the day, however long you'd
- 4 like to talk. Of course my office is up on the ninth
- 5 floor if anybody needs to check for hearing dates,
- 6 and my office is also up there if anybody has
- 7 anything to bring up with me.
- 8 Mr. Andersson, is there anything in
- 9 particular I can address? We can't really talk about
- 10 the case so much, but as far as how we're going
- 11 forward? Do you have any specific concerns or
- 12 questions?
- MR. ANDERSSON: No. You know, I'm not
- 14 an attorney or anything so I'm not familiar with what
- 15 exactly we're doing here in terms of -- I mean, you
- 16 explained that you want us to discuss the case, and I
- guess what they're expecting out of me if this is
- 18 gonna go to a hearing and what I'd like to have out
- 19 of them in terms of evidences or whatever.
- 20 You know, I'm -- I'm just at a loss, you
- 21 know. This is not something I do.
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: I understand, I
- 23 understand. From what you've told me, you seem to
- 24 understand the process pretty well. This is just
- 25 kind of the beginning, if you will. Again, this is

- 1 just at least so I know that we've had one
- 2 opportunity for all the parties to get together and
- 3 to talk and to see if we can resolve this dispute.
- And if we cannot, that's fine. Then
- 5 this gives you the chance to get together and see how
- 6 long you think it would take for the parties to get
- 7 ready for hearing. In other words, sometimes parties
- 8 may want to conduct discovery; that is, ask
- 9 questions, ask for documents. And you're, of course,
- 10 entitled to do the same from them. To see how long
- 11 that will take, to see how long you think a hearing
- 12 would take, how many witnesses the parties might want
- 13 to put on, that kind of thing.
- So this is just kind of the beginning,
- 15 getting ready for the hearing in case you can't
- 16 settle your dispute. Okay? Do you think you
- 17 understand kind of the purpose?
- MR. ANDERSSON: Yes.
- 19 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. Are there
- 20 any questions really about the procedure that I could
- 21 answer for you before I excuse myself?
- MR. BYRNE: No, your Honor.
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Okay, Mr. Byrne, thank
- 24 you.
- MR. ANDERSSON: I guess not at this

- 1 time.
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Okay. Mr. Andersson,
- 3 thank you very much. And what I'm going to do here
- 4 in a moment --
- 5 MR. DOTTHEIM: Judge?
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Dottheim, is there
- 7 anything?
- MR. DOTTHEIM: Yes. Excuse me.
- 9 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Yes, sir.
- 10 MR. DOTTHEIM: And you've indicated you
- 11 will be available?
- 12 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Yes, sir.
- MR. DOTTHEIM: You're on the ninth
- 14 floor --
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Yes, sir.
- MR. DOTTHEIM: -- so if we do have any
- 17 questions or if Mr. Andersson does later have any
- 18 questions --
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Right.
- 20 MR. DOTTHEIM: -- we can contact you by
- 21 visiting your office?
- 22 JUDGE PRIDGIN: That's correct. And we
- 23 would probably also -- and Mr. Andersson, if there
- 24 are any -- any questions, we would probably, since
- 25 Mr. Byrne is in St. Louis, we would need to contact

- 1 him by phone to include him in the conversation.
- 2 It's not proper for me to meet with one
- 3 party and not the other about this case. So you
- 4 are -- while you are free to come talk to me, if it's
- 5 really about the substance of the case, we would need
- 6 to allow Mr. Byrne to participate as well.
- 7 MR. ANDERSSON: I understand.
- 8 JUDGE PRIDGIN: So -- and I figured that
- 9 you did. And I'm sure Mr. Dottheim will answer any
- 10 questions you might have. And it sounds like you've
- 11 talked to Mr. Micheel from the Office of the Public
- 12 Counsel.
- MR. ANDERSSON: Yeah, just one time.
- 14 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. And you may
- 15 also want to talk to them and see if they're able to
- 16 assist you or not. I don't know.
- 17 MR. ANDERSSON: Okay. I did talk to one
- 18 gentleman on the phone who wanted to hear my story
- 19 per se from the Public Service Commission, and I
- 20 don't recall who that was.
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Okay.
- MR. ANDERSSON: So it would be nice if I
- 23 could get that information.
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Okay. Sure. And again,
- 25 this is a big purpose of today, is I'm going to

- 1 excuse myself in a moment, and you're free to talk
- 2 and to hopefully settle. Does anybody have any
- 3 further questions or concerns for me before we go off
- 4 the record?
- 5 MR. BYRNE: No, your Honor.
- JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Byrne, thank you.
- 7 Mr. Dottheim?
- 8 MR. DOTTHEIM: Not from the staff.
- 9 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. Thank you.
- 10 Mr. Andersson, anything else I can answer for you,
- 11 sir?
- MR. ANDERSSON: Not at this time.
- 13 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. Thank you.
- 14 What I'm going to do then is go off the record and
- 15 excuse myself. I'll ask you folks to remain to talk.
- 16 I'm gonna leave the speaker phone on. And once the
- 17 court reporter leaves, you might want to -- I'm sorry
- 18 we don't have very much room here.
- 19 You might want to crowd in where she's
- 20 working so you can hear each other better. And then,
- 21 Mr. Dottheim, whenever you're finished talking, if
- 22 you'll just either disconnect the call or let me know
- 23 if there's any problems you have with the telephone,
- 24 I would appreciate it.
- MR. DOTTHEIM: Certainly. Thank you.

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JUDGE PRIDGIN: And I'll note that my
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     Order has required a proposed schedule by August
     17th. Obviously if the parties need more time, feel
     free to -- somebody file a motion, and I'll be glad
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    to entertain that. All right. Anything else?
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                 All right. Hearing nothing, that will

     EC2005-0398. Thank you very much. We're off the
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    record.
