- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Well, welcome everyone.
- 3 We're here today for a prehearing conference in Case
- 4 No. EC-2005-0420, which is the case of Christian Atlakson
- 5 against Kansas City Power & Light. And to begin today,
- 6 we're going to take entries of appearance. We'll begin
- 7 with KCPL.
- 8 MR. LING: Paul Ling on behalf of Kansas
- 9 City Power & Light.
- 10 JUDGE WOODRUFF: And for the Complainant?
- 11 Just tell us your name.
- MR. ATLAKSON: Chris Atlakson.
- 13 JUDGE WOODRUFF: And you're representing
- 14 yourself?
- MR. ATLAKSON: Representing myself.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: And for Staff?
- 17 MR. FREY: Dennis Frey representing the
- 18 Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, P.O.
- 19 Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you, Mr. Frey.
- 21 Well, I asked you all to come to this
- 22 conference today so we can make some plans about the
- 23 future on how we're going to resolve this case as far as
- 24 hearing and whether a hearing is necessary and just to
- 25 discuss -- give you-all a chance to discuss possibilities

- 1 of settlement and so forth as well.
- 2 There has been a Staff report filed in this
- 3 case, and I'll ask you, Mr. Atlakson, do you disagree with
- 4 that Staff report?
- 5 MR. ATLAKSON: Is that the Expedited Staff
- 6 Investigation and Report?
- 7 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Yes, that was filed a few
- 8 weeks ago. You don't have to give me details about it.
- 9 Just --
- 10 MR. ATLAKSON: I knew that there were -- I
- 11 had some discrepancies with the Motion to Dismiss that
- 12 Mr. Ling had filed. I don't -- I can't say that I've
- 13 thoroughly read the report.
- 14 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Well, why don't you
- 15 go ahead and tell me your disagreements with the Motion to
- 16 Dismiss?
- 17 MR. ATLAKSON: In regards to that, I've
- 18 always had issues with they've -- I've been contacted
- 19 twice. I've received two letters in the past two years
- 20 from KCP&L, and they've -- they're constantly saying that
- 21 they made numerous and multiple attempts to contact me
- 22 either by phone or by mail. I only received two letters.
- 23 I've never received phone calls, except until Mr. Ling got
- 24 involved and he contacted me once.
- 25 Other than that, he also stated that I was

- 1 unwilling to make the necessary modifications in response
- 2 to this matter. I told Mr. Ling that I was -- I was
- 3 willing to make some sort of adjustments, but it was going
- 4 to take some time because it was a condition that the
- 5 previous owners had made, and they were the only previous
- 6 owners, to my knowledge. They had the home for 20 years,
- 7 and the condition has existed for 15-plus years. And I
- 8 told him that I did not have the money to pay an
- 9 electrician to come out and do the appropriate
- 10 modifications at this time.
- 11 When I spoke to Alan Bax on numerous
- 12 occasions, I explained to him that I wouldn't be able to.
- 13 We were planning on remodeling or moving the deck next
- 14 spring, and at that point in time I'd be able to possibly
- 15 modify the deck. But other than that, that's basically
- 16 where I stand.
- 17 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And this is as much
- 18 a question for you, Mr. Ling, as well as Mr. Atlakson.
- 19 Have you had a chance to discuss this matter in person or
- 20 by telephone?
- 21 MR. LING: I did contact Mr. Atlakson
- 22 earlier in June.
- 23 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And has the
- 24 situation changed at all as far as your ability to make
- 25 modifications or the need to make modifications?

- 1 MR. ATLAKSON: It's probably worsened being
- 2 that I've lost my job and I have no means, unless they
- 3 want my unemployment check. I don't have the funds,
- 4 especially now, to fix it. I am in contact with an
- 5 attorney currently trying to contact the previous owners.
- 6 They're refusing right now to acknowledge that -- anything
- 7 that we've sent to them. They do acknowledge to building
- 8 the deck 15-plus years ago and not getting a permit to
- 9 build the deck.
- 10 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Is that something that the
- 11 City of Independence would require a permit?
- 12 MR. ATLAKSON: According to Alan Bax, he
- 13 investigated. He called the County and asked if a permit
- 14 was ever issued to build the deck. I was always under the
- 15 impression that the deck structure had always been there.
- 16 When we moved in, they had replaced, like, the top boards
- 17 of the deck.
- 18 JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Well, it
- 19 sounds like what we're going to need to do is go ahead and
- 20 set this for hearing, which will be held here in Jefferson
- 21 City, and then Mr. Atlakson, you'll need to come to the
- 22 hearing, bring any documents you would want me to
- 23 consider.
- 24 Any witnesses you may have, you need to
- 25 bring them along as well, unless you can reach agreements

1 with the other parties about stipulating to certain facts.

- 2 If you can agree upon -- if you have, for example, a
- 3 document that you want to present, you may not necessarily
- 4 have to bring that witness, that person who wrote the
- 5 document to Jefferson City for the hearing if you can get
- 6 everybody to agree upon that, that the document can come
- 7 in without the witness, that sort of thing.
- 8 Mr. Frey, I'm sure you can discuss those
- 9 kind of things with him, too. Certainly Mr. Frey is not
- 10 your counsel, and I don't want to try and put him in that
- 11 position, and Mr. Ling as well. I think you've done some
- 12 hearings before before this Commission also, have you not,
- 13 Mr. Ling?
- MR. LING: Yes, sir.
- 15 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And from the sounds
- 16 of it, it's not a good situation with the wire being close
- 17 to the deck as well as the problems with the meter. So we
- 18 want to do this fairly quickly. I'm looking at the first
- 19 week of August. Mr. Ling and Mr. Frey, if you can check
- 20 calendars quick on that.
- 21 MR. LING: That would be set up for the
- 22 hearing the first week of August?
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Yes.
- MR. LING: Would we have any filed
- 25 testimony at all?

JUDGE WOODRUFF: No.
```

- 2 MR. LING: Okay. Just go over the
- 3 testimony.
- 4 JUDGE WOODRUFF: We would just have
- 5 everybody come and give their testimony.
- 6 MR. LING: Okay. The first week of August
- 7 is fine with us.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Mr. Frey?
- 9 MR. FREY: I think that will be okay. Let
- 10 me just check, your Honor. It appears to be okay, your
- 11 Honor.
- 12 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Do you have any preference
- 13 as to the day of the week? The whole week is clear on the
- 14 calendar.
- 15 MR. FREY: I would say sometime toward the
- 16 middle of the week would always be preferable.
- 17 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Wednesday okay? That
- 18 would be the 3rd.
- MR. FREY: That would be fine.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Mr. Ling, does that work
- 21 for you?
- MR. LING: I believe that's okay with us.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: And Mr. Atlakson?
- MR. ATLAKSON: Yes, that's fine.
- 25 MR. LING: Obviously I've got a little bit

of difficulty here because some of my testimony may come

- 2 from some people that aren't here right now.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: I understand. If that
- 4 does develop into a problem for you, just file a motion.
- 5 MR. LING: Thank you.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. I'm going to
- 7 go ahead and issue an Order, then, setting this for
- 8 hearing on Wednesday, August 3rd, beginning at 10 a.m.
- 9 MR. FREY: Would that be here, your Honor?
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: That will be here.
- 11 MR. FREY: 10 a.m.
- 12 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Any other matters that you
- 13 want to bring up while we're on the record? Hearing none.
- 14 MR. LING: Currently KCPL has a Motion to
- 15 Dismiss pending.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Yes.
- 17 MR. LING: Will that be ruled on prior to
- 18 the hearing?
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Yes.
- MR. LING: Okay. Thank you.
- 21 JUDGE WOODRUFF: And I'm not ruling on it
- 22 right now, but I'll take a look at that.
- 23 All right. With that, then, this
- 24 on-the-record portion of the prehearing conference is
- 25 adjourned.
