ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION FOR VARIANCE

Issue Date: June 5, 2014 Effective Date: June 15, 2014

On April 30, 2014, Kansas City Power & Light Company ("KCP&L") asked the Commission to grant it a variance from certain requirements of the Commission's Integrated Resource Planning Rule, 4 CSR 240-22. KCP&L asks the Commission to grant a variance from the Commission Rules 4 CSR 240-22.045(3)(B)2 and 4 CSR 240-22.045(3)(B)3 requiring regional transmission organization expansion plan analysis specific to Missouri customers. The Commission issued notice of this application and directed its Staff to file a recommendation regarding the request. On May 23, 2014, Staff filed a recommendation stating that it has no objection to KCP&L's application for a variance. No other responses or objections to the application were received.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-22.080(13) provides that applications for a variance made at least 12 months prior to a triennial compliance filing, such as the application filed by KCP&L, may be granted for good cause shown. Good cause means a good faith

request for reasonable relief.¹ KCP&L states in its application that the variance request is necessary because the data required to perform the Missouri-specific analysis is not available, as regional transmission plan results are not identified on a state-by-state level. Based upon KCP&L's verified application and Staff's recommendation, the Commission independently concludes that good cause exists to grant KCP&L its requested variance.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- The application for variance filed by Kansas City Power & Light Company on
 April 30, 2014, is granted.
 - 2. This order shall become effective on June 15, 2014.
 - 3. This case shall be closed on June 16, 2014.
