## ORDER NULLIFYING CERTIFICATE AND CLOSING CASE

Issue Date: August 3, 2005

Effective Date: August 13, 2005

This order nullifies the certificate of service authority of Globcom, Incorporated. On July 29, 2005, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission moved to nullify the certificate of service authority of Globcom, Incorporated. In support thereof, Staff states that this Commission granted Globcom, an Illinois corporation, a certificate of service authority to provide resold and facilities-based basic local telecommunications services in exchanges served by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, CenturyTel, and Sprint Missouri, Inc., in October 2003, in Case No.CA-2003-0505. Globcom has never filed either a tariff or an interconnection agreement.

Staff further states that the web site of the Office of the Missouri Secretary of State reports that the certificate of authority granted to Globcom was revoked on March 30, 2004. Section 351.602.3, RSMo 2000, states that "[t]he authority of a foreign corporation to transact business in this state ceases on the date shown on the certificate revoking its certificate of authority." Staff also states that Globcom continues to operate in Illinois and is in good standing in that state. Staff states that Globcom has not paid its minimal estimated assessment for 2005 and has not submitted its annual report for 2004.

Staff urges the Commission to nullify Globcom's certificate because it is no longer authorized to operate in Missouri and has never filed a tariff or interconnection agreement. Staff suggests that Globcom's certificate may be void by operation of law because Globcom did not exercise the authority thereby conferred within a year of its issuance. Section 392.410.5, RSMo.

The Commission finds that Globcom's certificate of service authority is null and void by operation of Section 392.410.5, RSMo, because Globcom did not exercise the authority thereby conferred within a year of its issuance.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the Motion to Open Case and Nullify Certificate of Service Authority,

filed on July 29, 2005, by the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, is granted.

2. That the certificate of service authority granted to Globcom, Incorporated, in October 2003, in Case No. CA-2003-0505, is null and void.

3. That this order shall become effective on August 13, 2005.

4. That this case may be closed on August 14, 2005.
