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- 2 JUDGE JONES: We're gonna go ahead and
- 3 go on the record and get started. Is that fine with
- 4 you.
- 5 MR. WALKER: That's fine.
- JUDGE JONES: This is Case Number
- 7 EC-2006-0451 Tony Walker, Complainant, versus Kansas
- 8 City Power & Light Company, Respondent. At this time
- 9 we'll take entries of appearances, beginning with the
- 10 Staff of the Commission.
- MS. HEINZ: My name is Jennifer Heintz.
- 12 I'm Assistant General Counsel with the Missouri
- 13 Public Service Commission. My address is 200 Madison
- 14 Street, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- JUDGE JONES: And Kansas City Power &
- 16 Light.
- 17 MR. BLANC: Curtis Blanc, B-l-a-n-c.
- 18 Address is 1201 Walnut, Kansas City, Missouri 64106.
- 19 JUDGE JONES: And Mr. Walker, I realize
- 20 you are unrepresented; is that true?
- MR. WALKER: Right.
- JUDGE JONES: And will you go ahead and
- 23 state your name and address?
- 24 MR. WALKER: Tony Walker, 1434 East
- 25 4910, Kansas City, Missouri 64110.

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1 JUDGE JONES: All right. And just so
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- 2 you know, Kansas City Power & Light is who you're
- 3 opposing.
- 4 MR. WALKER: Right.
- 5 JUDGE JONES: The Staff of the
- 6 Commission is -- they're a party to the case, but
- 7 their objective, they don't take a side. They simply
- 8 just recommend what they think is the correct course
- 9 to take to the Commission.
- 10 MR. WALKER: All right.
- 11 THE COURT: But they do not advocate
- 12 your position, but at the same time, they do not
- 13 advocate Kansas City Power & Light's position. It
- 14 just depends on whose position they think is legally
- 15 correct.
- Now, this prehearing conference, the
- 17 purpose of it is primarily to put you and Kansas City
- 18 Power & Light together in order to be able to discuss
- 19 your case. Have you talked to them at all --
- MR. WALKER: No.
- JUDGE JONES: Since this case had been
- 22 instituted? Okay. Well, this is an opportunity for
- 23 you all to talk about the case and see if you can
- 24 come to some resolution. If you cannot come to a
- 25 resolution on the case about the case, then we'll

- 1 proceed towards a hearing.
- 2 MR. WALKER: All right.
- JUDGE JONES: Okay? And with that, I
- 4 don't have anything else. Mr. -- Mr. Blanc, do you
- 5 have anything you'd like to discuss before I leave
- 6 you all to talk about this case?
- 7 MR. BLANC: No, sir.
- 8 JUDGE JONES: Ms. Heintz, do you have
- 9 anything?
- 10 MS. HEINTZ: No, thank you.
- JUDGE JONES: Mr. Walker, do you have
- 12 any questions or anything you'd like to talk about?
- 13 Because I'm going to leave the room and allow you all
- 14 to discuss the matter, because I can't be present.
- MR. WALKER: Well, I did want to add
- 16 that they received 300 more dollars from the United
- 17 Services June of this year, so that means the grand
- 18 total is \$1,452 that they received.
- 19 JUDGE JONES: Okay. Now, what you're
- 20 talking about now is something that would be a fact
- 21 if we had a hearing going on right now. That's
- 22 something I don't need to know at this point.
- MR. WALKER: Okay.
- JUDGE JONES: You may discuss that with
- 25 Mr. Blanc who represents Kansas City Power & Light

and with our Staff, Ms. Heintz, who represents the

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Staff Commission.

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    of is that you understand what's going on
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    procedurally.
