- 2 JUDGE RUTH: Good afternoon. My name is
- 3 Vicky Ruth, and I am assigned to preside over this case,
- 4 EO-2004-0603, in the matter of the application of
- 5 Aquilla, Inc. d/b/a Aquila Networks MPS and Osage Valley
- 6 Electric Cooperative for approval of a written territorial
- 7 agreement designating the boundaries of exclusive service
- 8 areas within Cass County, Missouri. Today's date is
- 9 Thursday, July 15, 2004, and it is 2 p.m.
- 10 We're here today for a simple scheduling
- 11 conference.
- 12 MR. BOUDREAU: If I might, it just occurred
- 13 to me we don't have Staff counsel here yet. I would
- 14 suggest maybe just giving another minute or two, if I may
- 15 be so bold.
- JUDGE RUTH: We'll go off the record for a
- 17 very short time.
- 18 (AN OFF-THE-RECORD DISCUSSION WAS HELD.)
- 19 JUDGE RUTH: I apologize, Mr. Dottheim. I
- 20 had just barely started when we realized that you were not
- 21 present. I had stated the name of the case, introduced
- 22 myself, and we were getting ready for entries of
- 23 appearance, and we'll go ahead and start with you.
- 24 MR. DOTTHEIM: And I apologize for not
- 25 being here when you started, or actually before you

- 5 JUDGE RUTH: Thank you. Mr. Boudreau?
- 6 MR. BOUDREAU: Yes, please. Let the record
- 7 reflect the appearance of Paul A. Boudreau, the law firm
- 8 of Brydon, Swearengen & England, Post Office Box 456,
- 9 Jefferson City, Missouri, appearing on behalf of joint --
- 10 one of the two joint applicants, Aquila Networks MPS.
- JUDGE RUTH: Ms. Chase?
- 12 MS. CHASE: My name is Lisa Chase and Jason
- 13 Paulsmeyer from the law firm Andereck, Evans, Milne,
- 14 Peace & Johnson, at 700 East Capitol, P.O. Box 1438,
- 15 Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, appearing on behalf of
- 16 Osage Valley Electric Cooperative.
- 17 JUDGE RUTH: Could you repeat your
- 18 associate's name?
- 19 MS. CHASE: Jason Paulsmeyer, spelled
- 20 P-a-u-l-s-m-e-y-e-r.
- JUDGE RUTH: Thank you.
- 22 MR. COFFMAN: And John B. Coffman appearing
- 23 on behalf of the Office of the Public Counsel, P.O. Box
- 24 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- 25 JUDGE RUTH: Thank you. Okay. Today's

1 prehearing or scheduling conference has been set in order

- 2 to facilitate the parties devising a procedural schedule
- 3 for this case, and I did bring down a copy of the
- 4 Commission's calendar for the next couple of months. I'll
- 5 leave this here. It is simply the hearings that have been
- 6 scheduled. I cannot guarantee that if a hearing's not
- 7 scheduled, that the Commissioners don't actually have
- 8 something else planned, but this is when the hearing room
- 9 would be available and I'll leave this, like I said, right
- 10 here for you.
- 11 I believe that the Order and Notice that
- 12 went out indicated that the parties should file a proposed
- 13 procedural schedule no later than July 21st, and that the
- 14 procedural schedule should provide for an evidentiary
- 15 hearing to take place on or before September 10th, 2004.
- I will add the caveat, if the parties all
- 17 agree that a hearing is not necessary and wish to instead
- 18 very quickly file a proceeding regarding that matter,
- 19 that's an option. I did not mean to preclude that as an
- 20 option. But if you file a proposed procedural schedule,
- 21 it needs to provide for the hearing on or before
- 22 September 10th.
- 23 Are there any other procedural matters or
- 24 otherwise actually that the parties have at this time?
- 25 Anything you want to bring up?

- 1 MR. BOUDREAU: I don't believe so. I
- 2 didn't actually check, nor did I receive any notice. I
- 3 assume that there were no other interventions in this
- 4 case.
- 5 JUDGE RUTH: You're right. I double
- 6 checked. There were no applications to intervene, and the
- 7 deadline has passed. I believe it was the 12th. And EFIS
- 8 indicates the only filings we've had are the initial
- 9 application and the Order and Notice that went out.
- 10 That's it. No applications to intervene.
- 11 Anything else a party wanted to bring up?
- 12 Okay. I'm not seeing anything. Then that will conclude
- 13 the on-the-record portion of the hearing. If the parties
- 14 come up with a date today and you want me to reserve it,
- 15 you're welcome to either stop by upstairs or call me and
- 16 I'll put it in yellow pending getting something in
- 17 writing. That would reserve it so nobody else jumps in
- 18 there between.
- 19 And I -- like I said, I had just mentioned
- 20 the other option. The Commission has been holding
- 21 evidentiary hearings for these territorial agreements, but
- 22 the Commission has discussed maybe they're not necessary
- 23 and has not made a decision. If the parties feel this is
- 24 something they want to pursue, you can, of course, file
- 25 something, but I'm not trying to twist your arm to make

you. But I'll expect to see something filed next -- is

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that Tuesday or Wednesday? I think the 21st may be
     Wednesday.
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                   MR. DOTTHEIM: Wednesday, yes.
                    JUDGE RUTH: Again, this is the
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     Commission's calendar. Thank you very much.
                    WHEREUPON, the recorded portion of the
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     scheduling conference was concluded.
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
