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JUDGE STEARLEY: Good morning. It is 1 Tuesday, December 13, 2011. The Commission set this 2 3 time for a prehearing conference in File No. EO-2011-4 0390, which is captioned as, In the matter of the 5 third prudence review of costs subject to the Commission approved fuel adjustment clause of KCP&L 6 7 Greater Missouri Operations Company. 8 My name is Harold Stearley, and I'm the 9 presiding officer over this matter, and we'll begin by taking entries of appearance, starting with KCP&L. 10 MR. FISCHER: Let the record reflect the 11 appearance of James M. Fischer, Fischer and Dority, 12 13 PC, 101 Madison street, Suite 400, Jefferson City, 14 Missouri, appearing on behalf of the Company today, 15 KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company.

16 JUDGE STEARLEY: And the Commission staff. 17 MS. WILLIAMS: Nathan Williams and Amy 18 Moore, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. 19 JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Williams. 20 And the Office of Public Counsel. Mr. MILLS: On behalf of the Office of 21 22 Public Counsel and the public, my name is Lewis 23 Mills. My address is P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson City, 24 Missouri 65102.

JUDGE STEARLEY: And the Industrials.

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MR. CONRAD: Okay. If Mr. Woodsmall hasn't 1 2 shown up, I'm Stuart Conrad -- and David Woodsmall --3 Finnegan, Conrad & Peterson, 3100 Broadway, Suite 1209, Kansas City, Missouri 64111, and the telephone 4 5 number is 816.753.1122. JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Conrad, and 6 you're here for Sedalia Industrial Energy Users and Ag 7 8 Processing; correct? 9 MR. CONRAD: Yes, that would be correct. Yes. I'm actually just trying to think whether it was 10 11 the Energy Users Association or the -- I think it was the latter. 12 13 JUDGE STEARLEY: I also noticed on our automatic parties we have the County of Jackson with 14 Mr. Finnegan represented. I know he's with your 15 16 office as well, but I don't --MR. CONRAD: Yes. I'm sorry. I think he 17 18 was going to enter an appearance, but he has not done so at this point -- I didn't hear him, so if you would 19 like to show that, I'll be happy to --20 JUDGE STEARLEY: Yeah, I just was going to 21 22 ask if you wanted to enter an appearance for him. Ιf 23 not, I'll just reflect that he did not. MR. CONRAD: Well, if you wanted to do 24 that, that would be fine, sir. I don't -- whatever 25

1 the proper procedure is.

JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Well, I think you 2 3 could probably enter an appearance for him since you're from the same office, unless -- well, unless 4 5 you've got conflicting interest with -- the County objects, in which that may be a problem, so maybe 6 7 not. We'll just reflect that Mr. Finnegan is not here 8 today. 9 In terms of our other automatic parties, I have the Commercial Group, AARP, City of Kansas City, 10 11 the Federal Executive Agencies, and MDNR. Is there 12 anyone appearing on behalf of those parties? 13 (No response.) 14 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Hearing none, we'll reflect they did not enter any appearances. 15 16 JUDGE STEARLEY: Mr. Lowry e-mailed me yesterday on behalf of Union Electric and asked to be 17 18 excused from today's rehearing, and I granted him that 19 excusal. 20 Is there anyone else that I might have missed? 21 MR. LUMLEY: Judge, this is Carl Lumley for 22 23 Dogwood Energy. 24 JUDGE STEARLEY: Sorry, Mr. Lumley. I didn't mean to skip over you there. We'll reflect 25

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that you've entered your appearance for Dogwood
 Energy.

question about -- if I could get an idea of general
timing for when you think this hearing may be or when
a Commission decision is needed.
