ORDER GRANTING DOGWOOD ENERGY'S APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

On September 26, 2008, the Commission's Staff filed a notice indicating commencement of its prudence audit of the fuel adjustment clause established by the Commission for Aquila, Inc. d/b/a KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company. The Commission provided notice of Staff's filing to potentially interested parties and established October 29 as the deadline for potential parties to file applications to intervene.

Dogwood Energy, LLC, filed an application to intervene on October 22. More than ten days have passed since Dogwood filed its application to intervene and no party has objected to that application.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4) provides that the Commission may grant an application to intervene if: "(A) The proposed intervenor has an interest which is different from that of the general public and which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case; or (B) Granting the proposed intervention would serve the public interest." Dogwood owns a generating facility located within Aquila's service area. Therefore, Dogwood has an interest in how the Staff and this Commission interpret Aquila's fuel adjustment clause. As a result, the Commission finds that Dogwood's interest in this case

is different from that of the general public, and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Furthermore, the Commission finds that allowing Dogwood to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, the Commission will grant Dogwood's application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Dogwood Energy, LLC's Application to Intervene is granted.
- 2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
