ORDER GRANTING MOTIONS TO STAY PROCEEDINGS

On November 18, 2009, the City of Campbell, Missouri, filed a motion to stay proceedings in this case. The City related that its City Council has approved a bid by Ozark Border Electric Cooperative to purchase the City's electrical service system. The City anticipated that it and Ozark Border will sign a contract for sale and purchase of distribution facilities, and that the City will conduct an election in February 2010 for its residents to vote on whether to approve that contract. If the contract is approved, the City will transfer its electrical system to Ozark Border in 2010 and the Applicant will become a customer of Ozark Border as he requests in his application.

On December 4, 2009, Ozark Border also filed a motion to stay proceedings. Ozark Border agrees that a stay would be in the best interest of all parties.

The Commission directed Mr. Byrne to notify the Commission whether he would agree to a stay of proceedings or whether he wished to continue prosecution of his case. On December 7, 2009, Mr. Byrne filed a letter stating his agreement to a stay of proceedings until after the municipal election in February 2010 is held.

As all parties agree, the Commission will grant the motions to stay the proceedings. The Commission will direct the City to report the results of the election.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Motions to Stay Proceedings filed by the City of Campbell, Missouri, and Ozark Border Electric Cooperative are granted.
2. The City of Campbell, Missouri, shall file a status report no later than March 1, 2010, advising the Commission of the results of the February 2010 municipal election regarding the contract for sale and purchase of electric distribution facilities between the City and Ozark Border Electric Cooperative.
3. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
