## ORDER DENYING MOTION TO REQUEST DOCUMENT

On March 24,<sup>1</sup> Union Electric Company, d/b/a AmerenUE ("AmerenUE"), submitted an Application to the Commission. AmerenUE wants to transfer certain of its assets to St. James Municipal Utilities ("St. James") and Rolla Municipal Utilities ("Rolla"), two wholesale customers of AmerenUE.

The Commission issued notice on April 5, and that notice allowed until April 26 for interested persons to request intervention. Donna D. Hawley ("Ms. Hawley") filed such a request on April 26. Over the objection of St. James and Rolla, the Commission granted Ms. Hawley's request on July 7.

On July 2, Ms. Hawley filed a Motion to Request Document.<sup>2</sup> She requests a copy of "the full engineering report prepared by R.W. Beck for the Rolla Municipal Utilities Power Delivery Master Plan dated October 2007."<sup>3</sup>

On July 6, Rolla objected, and pointed out several Commission discovery rules with which Ms. Hawley failed to comply.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.090 contains the Commission's discovery rules, a copy of which is provided to Ms. Hawley as a courtesy.<sup>4</sup> Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.090(8) states that the Commission will not entertain any discovery motions until certain requirements have been satisfied. Ms. Hawley does not allege that she has met those requirements, which include a conferring or attempting to confer in good faith with opposing counsel prior to filing the motion, certifying compliance with the rule, and arranging for a telephone conference with the presiding officer and opposing counsel.

The Commission will deny Ms. Hawley's motion.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The Motion to Request Document filed by Donna D. Hawley is denied.
- 2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
