3	JUDGE WOODRUFF: At this point we're on
4	the record. We're here for a procedural conference
5	in File No. EM-2019-0150 which concerns the
6	application of Grain Belt Express Clean Line for
7	Approval of its Acquisition by Invenergy
8	Transmission.
9	We'll start today by taking entries of
10	appearance beginning with Grain Belt.
11	MR. ZOBRIST: Good morning, Judge. Karl
12	Zobrist and Jacqueline Whipple from Dentons US, LLP
13	on behalf of Grain Belt Express Clean Line, LLC.
14	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And,
15	Ms. Callenbach, also?
16	MS. CALLENBACH: Yes. Anne Callenbach
17	and Andrew Schulte on behalf of Invenergy.
18	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. For Staff.
19	MR. THOMPSON: Kevin Thompson, Post
20	Office box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102 for
21	the staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission.
22	With me is Natelle Dietrich.
23	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And Public
24	Counsel.
25	MR. WILLIAMS: Nathan Williams, chief

deputy public counsel appearing on behalf of the
Office of the Public Counsel and the public. My
information has been provided to the court reporter.
JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. And did
someone else just join us?
UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: That was my phone
buzzing, Judge. I apologize.
JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. For Missouri
Landowners, Show-Me Concerned Landowners, and Joseph
and Rose Kroner.
MR. AGATHEN: Yes. This is Paul Agathen,
45 Oak Field Court, Washington, Missouri 63090. And,
Judge, I apologize for not being there in person,
but the weather forecast was for ice along the roads
so I thought it better not to try it.
JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And I would say
you were very wise. It is very icy here and we've
had a lot of people that have had trouble getting in
today. In fact, the bridges are very, very icy and
backed up a long way, so.
MR. AGATHEN: It just didn't sound good.
JUDGE WOODRUFF: You made a wise
decision.
MR. AGATHEN: Thank you.
JUDGE WOODRUFF: Renew Missouri?

1	MR. OPITZ: Thank you, Judge. Tim Opitz
2	for Renew Missouri and I've provided my information
3	to the court reporter.
4	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And for MJMEUC.
5	MR. HEALY: Doug Healy, Healy Law
6	Offices.
7	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. I believe
8	that takes care of all the parties.
9	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Judge, I would
10	also say that Hans Detweiler from Grain Belt Express,
11	not a lawyer, representative of the party is also on
12	the line.
13	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Very good.
14	MS. CALLENBACH: And, Judge, this is Anne
15	Callenbach. Nicole Luckey, also not well, she may
16	be a lawyer, but she's the Invenergy representative,
17	she may be joining as well.
18	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Not a problem.
19	MS. CALLENBACH: Thank you.
20	JUDGE WOODRUFF: There's a couple things
21	I want to deal with today. First of all, the
22	applications to intervene and then the procedural
23	schedule.
24	First of all on the applications to
25	intervene, we've got applications from Renew Missouri

1 and MJMEUC. Is anyone as opposed to their 2 applications to intervene? Hearing no opposition to those, I will go ahead and grant their applications 3 to intervene. I'll issue a notice later today making 5 that apparent on the record. 6 We also have applications to intervene 7 from the Missouri Landowners, Show-Me Concerned 8 Landowners and Joseph and Rose Kroner. There was no 9 opposition to the actual intervention of the 10 landowners or Show-Me Concerned Landowners and there 11 was a, I guess I'd call it a partial opposition 12 from Grain Belt asking that they be limited in what they -- what issues they can bring forward. Anyone 13 wish to be heard on that aspect? 14 15 MR. ZOBRIST: Judge, I'll defer to Mr. Callenbach or Mr. Schulte. 16 17 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. 18 MS. CALLENBACH: Thank you, Karl. 19 Judge, judge this is Anne Callenbach. 20 What we filed several days ago, we were concerned about limiting the issues that the Landowner group 21 22 and the Kroners could bring up simply because MLA and 23 Show-Me were involved in the CCN proceeding that 24 recently concluded in December on remand. And we simply don't want to waste the Commission's time 2.5

relitigating any of those issues. We requested that 1 2 they be limited to Landowner specific issues. also had a concern about the Kroners and what they 3 might add in addition to the Landowner group. 4 5 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And your position 6 hasn't changed on that? 7 MS. CALLENBACH: No, sir. 8 JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. And, 9 Mr. Agathen, I know that you've already filed a 10 written response to that. Anything you want to add? 11 MR. AGATHEN: Nothing to add beyond 12 what's filed in the written response, Judge. 13 JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. I'm not 14 going to make a ruling on that today because it is 15 not a posed motion. I'll go ahead and put that on 16 agenda for the Commission to actually make the ruling 17 on that. 18 For thus far, the -- like I say, the opposition to the intervention of Missouri Landowners 19 20 and Show-Me Concerned Landowners is only partial 21 opposition, so I'll go ahead and grant their 22 application to intervene at this point. The ruling 23 on the request to limit their participation will be 24 made in a subsequent Commission order. 2.5 As far as the Kroners, since they are --

their opposition -- or application to intervene has 1 2 been opposed, that will also be decided in that future Commission order. I plan to put that on for 3 agenda for next week. And of course I don't control the -- what goes on the agenda, but I anticipate 5 6 we'll be able to make a ruling on that fairly 7 quickly. 8 Anything else as far as interventions? 9 MR. AGATHEN: I have nothing, Judge. 10 Paul Agathen. 11 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you, Mr. Agathen. 12 And I appreciate, Mr. Agathen, indicating who is 13 speaking. And the court reporter requested that we make that clear, that when you're speaking on the 14 15 telephone, tell us who it is speaking. 16 The other matter I want to bring up is 17 the procedural schedule. A proposed procedural 18 schedule was filed a couple days ago and it called 19 for a hearing on April 23rd and 24th. As some of you 20 may know, there is a, currently another hearing scheduled on the Commission's calendar for the 24th. 21 22 However, it's our intention to move that hearing back 23 a day to the 25th so that we will be able to have the 24 hearing on this case on the 23rd and 24th. 2.5 And I will be also issuing an order to

1	formally adopt the procedural schedule, but it looks
2	to be acceptable to myself and to the Commission.
3	And I congratulate the parties for being able to
4	reach an agreement that quickly on procedural
5	schedule.
6	All right. That's all I had to talk
7	about today. The other reason for having these
8	procedural conferences is just to get a chance to
9	get all the parties in the room together or at least,
10	in this case, on the telephone. So I'll go off the
11	line and conclude the on-the-record portion of this
12	proceeding at this point. I'll leave the phone line
13	open. You have the phone line is ours until 11:00
14	and I'll leave you to your discussion.
15	So at this point
16	MR. AGATHEN: Are you going to stay
17	there?
18	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Pardon me?
19	MR. AGATHEN: This is Paul Agathen. Are
20	you going to stay after you go off the record?
21	JUDGE WOODRUFF: No. I'll be leaving the
22	room so you can have a conversation just amongst
23	yourselves. The court reporter will not be taking it
24	down.
25	MR. AGATHEN: If you don't mind, I do

1	have one point on the procedural schedule.
2	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Go ahead.
3	MR. AGATHEN: I agreed with the other
4	parties not to include a date for submission of
5	proposed findings and conclusions. In the event that
6	you decide to add that in as a filing, I would
7	request that it be scheduled for two days after the
8	two days to reply briefs.
9	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. I normally don't
10	request that, but I'll keep that in mind if it if
11	we do do that.
12	MR. AGATHEN: Thank you, Judge.
13	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Anything else anyone
14	else wants to bring up? All right. Then at this
15	point the on-the-record portion of this proceeding is
16	adjourned and I'll leave you to your discussions.
17	Thank you all very much.
