My reaction is that Ms. Hertzog's planned use of the application as direct testimony is not what the procedural schedule contemplates. The application was a pleading, it has had responsive pleadings. Her application is not testimony as to the issues. The schedule contemplated Ms. Hertzog would file testimony addressing the issues framed by the pleadings. She didn't, and now the rest of the parties have nothing to rebut. Therefore there will be no evidence in the record upon which the Commission can rule, and her application should be dismissed.

I would propose to file either a motion to dismiss, or a motion to cancel the procedural schedule and have another prehearing conference. In addition I have outstanding discovery requests that have not been fulfilled by Ms. Hertzog.

Before I file anything, I would like to survey the parties for their ideas as to what to do. I would ask Ms. Hertzog and all counsel to respond to this request, and include us all on that response. Please respond by November 27.
