Ordinance No. 336

AN ORDINANCE TO MAINTAIN GROSS RECEIPTS TAXES IMPOSED UPON AMEREN UE COMPANY

WHEREAS, The General Assembly of the State of Missouri enacted in its 1985 Session House Bill Number 200 repealing and enacting a new § 393.275 RSMo, and

WHEREAS, by authority of this law the city can maintain gross receipt tax that it imposes upon Ameren UE Company, and

WHEREAS, the city has been notified by the Missouri Public Service Commission under the authority of § 393.275 RSMo. That said corporation has received a tariff increase in excess of 7 percent, and,


WHEREAS, it is necessary for the continued operation of the city that the municipal gross receipt tax upon said company be maintained at its present rate,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WYACONDA, MISSOURI, as follows:

Section 1. That the City of Wyaconda, in order to maintain its source of revenue at its historical level, hereby determines to maintain the Five percent gross receipt tax against the Ameren UE Company.

Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to send a copy of this ordinance to Ameren UE Company and to the Public Service Commission.






