ORDER ACKNOWLEDGING AUTOMATIC PARTIES

On September 26, 2008, the Commission's Staff filed a notice indicating commencement of its prudence audit of the fuel adjustment clause established by the Commission for Aquila, Inc. d/b/a KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company. The Commission provided notice of Staff's filing to potentially interested parties and established October 29 as the deadline for potential parties to file applications to intervene.

On October 29, Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE filed an application to intervene. AmerenUE points out that Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-3.161(10) provides that parties to the rate case in which the Commission established Aquila's fuel adjustment clause are automatically parties to this prudence audit case, without the necessity of having to apply for intervention. The Commission therefore acknowledges that the parties to ER-2007-0004 are parties to this case, and will direct its Data Center to add those parties to the service list.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:
