ORDER OPENING A FILE REGARDING SPECIAL CONTEMPORARY RESOURCE PLANNING ISSUES AND OFFERING PARTIES AN OPPORTUNITY TO FILE SUGGESTIONS

A provision in the Commission's evised electric utility resource planning rule, 4 CSR 240-22.080(4), requires Missou ri's electric utilities to consider and ana lyze special contemporary issues in their triennial compliance filings and in their annual update reports. The regulation requires the Commission to i ssue an order by November 1 of each year specifying the list of special contemporary issues that each electric utility is to address. The regulation also provides that by September 15, Staff, Public Counsel, and other interested parties may file suggested issues for consideration. The regulation then allows the utilities and other parties until October 1 to file comments regarding the suggested issues.

The Commission has created this file to fa cilitate the process established by the regulation. Any party that wishes to suggest an issue for consideration by KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company may file its suggestion in this case by September 15. All parties to KCPL-GMO's most recent resource planning case, EE-2009-0237 will be made parties to this case.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. All parties to Case Number EE-2009-0237 are made parties to this case.
- 2. Any party wishing to suggest a special contemporary issue that KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company should consider in its triennial compliance filings and in its annual update reports shall file its written suggestion no later than September 15, 2011.
 - 3. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
