1. This prudence review of Empire	District Electric Company d/b/a
Liberty's ("Empire") costs related to its fuel ac	djustment clause (FAC) is for the
period March 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022.	
2. In late March 2022, Empire's N	eosho Ridge wind farm suffered
malfunctions to its primary and back-up transfor	mers, resulting in an outage.¹
3. On March 28, 2022, Empire filed	d incident report No. I202200111
with the Commission, wherein Empire stated, in	part;

6. On May 23, 2022, two months after the outage began, the local newspaper near Neosho Ridge, the *Parsons Sun* in Parsons, Kansas, reported:

GALESBURG – The wind turbines remain idle in Neosho Ridge Wind more than two months after two transformers malfunctioned.

The industrial wind complex has 139 turbines located mostly in and around Galesburg and Thayer.

"We continue our efforts to restore operations at the Neosho Ridge Wind farm. The two transformers that failed are en route to the manufacturer for repairs," said Kelli Price, Liberty Utilities senior manager of communications and marketing. "They weigh approximately 200,000 pounds each and are being transported by rail. We do not have a specific time frame for repairs."

7. On June 1, 2022, Empire's rate increase from its general rate case became effective³ and Empire began charging customers for Empire's wind generation investments, including the Neosho Ridge wind farm.

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- 9. On September 1, 2022, the Staff opened this docket to review the prudence of FAC-related costs for March 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022.
- 10. On October 3, 2022, more than (6) months after the start of the Neosho Ridge outage, Public Counsel sent a data request to Empire that again sought to understand the cause of the outage. Public Counsel requested from Empire, "Please provide the root cause analysis for the malfunction of the Neosho Ridge transformers." Empire's October 20, 2022 response states, "The root cause analysis will be provided when it becomes available."
- 11. Almost a year has passed since the Neosho Ridge outage, and Public Counsel is still awaiting the root cause analysis.
- 12. On February 24, 2023, the Staff closed the Neosho Ridge incident No. I202200111 without explanation, and four (4) days later, filed the Staff's Tenth Prudence Review Report ("Report") in this case.
 - 13. The Staff's Report does not mention the Neosho Ridge outage.
- 14. This docket is the appropriate venue to provide an analysis of whether the extended Neosho Ridge outage and any resulting customer impacts through August 31, 2022 were the result of imprudence.
