**ORDER DIRECTING NOTICE OF APPLICATION, ESTABLISHING  
INTERVENTION FILING DATE, AND SCHEDULING A PROCEDURAL  
CONFERENCE**

On January 7, 2014, Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCP&L) applied to the Commission for approval of Demand-Side Programs and for authority to establish a Demand-Side Investment Mechanism (DSIM) as contemplated by the Missouri Energy Efficiency Investment Act (MEEIA) and the Commission's implementing regulations. The Commission will provide notice of KCP&L's application to potentially interested individuals and entities and will invite them to apply to intervene as parties.

As KCP&L's application explains, the Commission's rule requires the Commission to act on that application within 120 days, which in this case is May 7, 2014. Therefore, the Commission will require applications to intervene to be filed quickly.<sup>1</sup> The Commission will also schedule a prehearing conference at which the parties may discuss how the Commission should best proceed to consider KCP&L's application.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The Commission's Data Center shall send a copy of this order to each party to Kansas City Power & Light Company's most recent triennial IRP case (EO-2012-0323), and to the county commission of each county within Kansas City Power & Light Company's service area.

2. The Commission's Public Information Office shall make notice of this order available to the members of the General Assembly representing the counties within Kansas City Power & Light Company's service area, and to the news media serving that service area.

3. Applications to intervene shall be filed no later than January 21, 2014.

4. Any party wishing to respond to any application to intervene shall do so no later than January 24, 2014.

5. A prehearing conference is scheduled for January 30, 2014, at 11:00 a.m. in Room 305 at the Commission's office at the Governor Office Building, 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City, Missouri, Room 305. This building meets accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act. 6. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
