ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME TO RESPOND TO AMEREN MISSOURI'S MOTION TO STRIKE PORTIONS OF THE DIRECT TESTMONY OF GEOFF MARKE

On October 31, 2014, Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed a motion asking the Commission to strike portions of the direct testimony filed by Public Counsel's witness. By Commission rule, the other parties are allowed ten days to respond to Ameren Missouri's motion, unless the Commission establishes some other date for response.¹

The procedural schedule for this case requires the parties to file rebuttal testimony by November 17. If the parties are to know what direct testimony they must rebut, the Commission will need to rule on Ameren Missouri's motion no later than its agenda meeting of November 12. The ten-day rule would make responses due by November 10. That would not allow the Commission sufficient time to consider any response before its November 12 agenda meeting. For that reason, the Commission will shorten the time allowed for responding to Ameren Missouri's motion to November 5.
