I would like to wish the commissioner's a good day and explain that, because I have a broken leg, Toni Wiseman has kindly agreed to read my statement.

My name is Darlys Bremer. I live at 24305 S. Harper Rd. and have lived here since January 1, 1970 and in the community since 1967.

Before this whole thing started, if anyone had asked me if I wanted an electric facility across the road from me, I would probably have said no. In retrospect, I can think of no better place for it. It immediately abuts relatively few people, and is adjacent to a gas pumping station that was established in the mid 1950's.

I have watched this plant being built, carefully landscaped and maintained. I've seen the efforts Aquila has made to become good neighbors. More than the obvious things, in this neighborhood, pavement and trees, are the things they have done, and are still doing, in and for the surrounding community. I particularly appreciate the fire hydrants which not only made my home safer but lowered my Homeowners' insurance premiums.

The projected growth of Peculiar and the surrounding area will continue to fuel the ever growing demand for electricity. I believe there is a need for this facility, and the future will probably require more like it.

We, people as a whole, tend to say "why me". In this case "Why does it have to be close to me". The fact is, it has to be close to someone. And, while it might not be the view I would prefer, I happen to be addicted to the comforts electricity affords me including central air and heat, television, refrigeration, etc. In 2004, when Osage Valley browned out, I appreciated that Aquila was there to back them up. I listen to people complain and I wonder how many of them would like to do without those comforts. One woman said that she remembered coal oil lamps and wood stoves. I too remember those and it makes me even more grateful for my 'addictions'.

I sincerely hope you, as the Missouri Public Commission, can find a way for Aquila to remain at the South Harper location.



I have a couple of bones to pick with the Cass County politicians. The power plant near Peculiar is an asset to the county. The property taxes on a \$14(0) million is substantial. I helped design a power plant in Oklahoma where the property taxes helped build a concrete football stadium.

I have experienced with the situation in California. Each time the power company wanted to build a plant, the local residents resisted.

Consequently, they suffered brown-outs and blackouts. The power company got permission form Utah to build a plant there. Utah people got the jobs and the taxes. Transmission power losses to move power hundreds of miles was considerable, thus costing customers in California.

It is absolutely a stupid idea to allow politicians to require the power company to tear down this plant because a few local residents object. If this plant was coal-fired, the locals might have a leg to stand on. I have heard of no railroad spur being built, so I assume this plant is oil or gas fired, probably a simple cycle gas turbine.

Every year we all use more kilowatts than we did the year before. I am hoping that the state PSC uses more common sense than the Cass County politicians.

To Whom It May Concern:

Some of us here in Millers Point are neither for nor against this issue, but would like to express our gratitude for your continued effort to make amends to this community and invest extra time and money in developing our ever-growing area. Aquila has done an excellent job in following through with plans of action as well as updating the neighbors every month and their continued efforts to satisfy continuous complaints.

At first our objections to this issue were the same as everyone else's. We feel that was mainly because it happened so quickly and came as such a surprise – not just to those close by, but for others both within and around the City of Peculiar. Although we do not claim to understand the politics that seem to surround this situation, and did not agree with the way things started out, Aquila has continuously tried to meet and exceed the expectations of everyone involved from the State of Missouri on down.

All 26 lots within Millers Point have 3 or more acres. There is only one house that can even see the plant. As for the other end — over half of them were building and moving in as the plant was being built. The noise is barely audible even when you approach the plant. The landscaping they did has improved the aesthetics of the plant greatly as well as the surrounding area around the plant.

Someone had to know about this major project or they couldn't have purchased the land it now sits on. It is hard to believe that no one knew anything. How were the contract workers, gravel trucks, road crew, etc. able to work – they had to have advanced notice, place bids and permits to event be on the site (didn't they?), as well as insurance to work on such a project. Are you telling us that the County, State or any other official had no clue this was going on?

The Williams Electric plant next to Aquila is far worse in appearance and sound than Aquila. At times you would think that the place was going to blow anytime when it would pop a gas leak. Talk about loud.

Maybe we owe StopAquila for a few of our improvements but certainly not all of them. Aquila putting landscaping in, fixing and paving roads, installing fire hydrants, and donating \$83,000 for Warning Sirens were items they were planning on doing from the beginning.

Aquila has also supplied lights for a ball field, and has always be open for more suggestions on how they may improve our way of life out here. They have purchased home of those who did not want to stay.

They planted hundreds of trees in many of the resident's yards to block the view of the plant. Aquila also stepped up to the plate and paid all StopAquila's legal fees until recently and even paid to have their Web site developed and set up.

Aquila has had monthly Community Meetings at the plant, offers tours, and continuously asks what more they can do for our community. Some resident volunteers are working side-by-side with Aquila to accomplish most of the community improvements. Norm Dunn and Tom Miller deserve a big applause for an EXCELLENT job.

We say leave it alone and let's concentrate on working together and not against each other.

### Dear Commissioners:

Not too long ago I had to reset ALL the clocks in the house and realized we've got a lot of 'stuff' depending on electricity. Then I saw yard signs that say 'stop Aquila'. Asking why the only answer I got was 'its in my back yard' not we don't need it or such just 'its in my back yard' and they live in town. Anyway I looked a little farther.

Aquila was built in a logical spot. They use gas to fire the turbines (or whatever) and there was, and has been for years, a gas company at 243<sup>rd</sup> and Harper Road. Also they needed lines for the power generated and low and behold there were lines in the area that were run in the 1950's or sooner. And the location is kind of in the country, for now. As fast as Cass County is growing that won't be true for long.

Then I wondered how many Cass County residents would it take to screw in a light bulb? Using just Peculiar to figure this, and I'm not good at math so bear with me, I came up with the following.

The last census Peculiar had about 2,600 persons – planning another 2,500 homes which will reasonably hold 2 persons each that's 5,000 more and some will have at least the normal 2.5 children (lets say 2/3 as reasonable for this exercise) that's 4,170. Now we have approximately 11,770 people in Peculiar. That means televisions, air conditioners, dvd, and cd players, radios, computers, washers, dryers (and for total electric homes furnaces and etc.) and the clocks – can't forget the clocks.

At present in the summer when the 2,600 of us here now get stuff going we have little brown outs, from a few minutes to several hours. What happens when 11,770 more or less want to turn things on? California here we come – major brown outs.

I didn't want a fire station in my front yard or 70 houses in my back yard but that's called progress. We retired to the country, small town atmosphere, open pastures, fresh air and I'm sure that's what is bringing other folks here as well. Plus those with children like the school system. With progress comes change and the price of change includes the things needed to support those changes. Bigger water/sewer systems, more paved roads, more businesses and more electricity.

I've heard lots of things, reasons, for the fight with Aquila. Maybe errors were made by all concerned but now's the time to go back to the drawing board, suck it up and look at the future needs, or if not needs requirements.

Check utility bills and you'll find like I did electricity is the cheapest thing going.

Now back to screwing in the light bulb. If we let Aquila go the answer will be none, zip, zero, nada. Back to kerosene lamps and wind up clocks for Cass County.

Cass County is bigger than that and I know there is a solution. If we just calmly think about the long term it can be resolved reasonably and rationally and to the benefit of all, mainly me the consumer with lots of clocks.

Having considered all the pros and cons of an electrical generating facility in our neighborhood my wife and I sold 74 acres of farmland to Aquila to build a peaking plant. We based this decision on the following thoughts.

We have lived 44 years 500 feet from what is now known as the Southern Star Compressor Station a facility that increases the pressure of natural gas on a 12-inch and a 20-inch line crossing the property.

There are three large motors used to accomplish this task. In the years we have lived here raising our four children we have never had any complaint or regret for building our home in close proximity to this facility. Having experienced this good neighbor policy from Southern Star over the past years, we believed Aquila's generating plant would not pose a problem to the community.

We asked a well-known realtor in our area to evaluate the effect on property values the construction of Aquila's Plant might have on the surrounding property. It was their opinion there would be little or no effect do to the fact that all the homes within 1/2 mile of this location were built after the Southern Star Compressor Plant was built and the two facilities Southern Star and Aquila area approximately 500 feet apart.

We believe and have proved to ourselves in the year of operation by Aquila that there are not problems of noise or exhaust from this plant. Both Southern Star and Aquila run three motors use natural gas as their fuel and are under the same government agencies for regulation.
