3. All parties shall provide copies of testimony, exhibits or pleadings to other counsel by electronic means essentially concurrent with the filing of such testimony exhibits or pleadings.

4. Data requests shall be served electronically on the attorneys for all parties contemporaneously with data request service on the party from whom the response is requested. Any party seeking a copy of the response to a data request issued by another party shall serve that request on the party to whom the original request was directed.

5. The response time for all data requests shall be 10 calendar days to provide the requested information, and 5 business days to object or to notify the issuing party that more than 10 calendar days will be needed to provide the requested information.

6. Commission rules 4 CSR 240-2.045(2) and 2.080(11) are waived. Filings made in the Commission's Electronic Filing and Information System are deemed timely if filed before midnight on the date the filing is due.
