**ORDER STAYING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

On July 17, 2014, the Commission established a procedural schedule to consider the change requests filed by the Commission’s Staff and Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri. That procedural schedule was subsequently modified to provide for responses to those change requests to be filed by August 29, with an evidentiary hearing following on September 24 and 25. On August 19, Ameren Missouri and Staff filed a joint motion asking the Commission to indefinitely stay the procedural schedule.

The movants explain that they continue to evaluate the final EM&V Reports and that those reports will need to be revised. In addition, they report they are continuing to negotiate toward a possible settlement of their disagreements. For that reason, they ask that the procedural schedule be indefinitely stayed until the situation becomes clear enough to develop a replacement procedural schedule, if a hearing is necessary.

The motion represents that the other two parties that have actively participated in this case, Public Counsel, and the Missouri Department of Economic Development – Division of Energy, do not object to the motion.

The Commission will grant the motion to stay the procedural schedule.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The procedural schedule previously established for this case is indefinitely stayed.
2. The hearing scheduled for September 24 and 25, 2014, is cancelled.
3. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
