ORDER STRIKING PART OF ADDITIONAL EXHIBIT

On August 28, 2013, the Commission issued an order that granted in part Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri's motion seeking to strike from evidence a number of documents that were offered into evidence by members of the public at the local public hearings. In that order, the Commission struck several documents as hearsay, including a September 1, 2011 newspaper article entitled "Leaks from Ameren toxic waste pond in Labadie stir fears". The Commission's order identified that article as being a portion of Exhibit I.

Later on August 28, Ameren Missouri filed a Motion for Clarification of Order Regarding Objections and Motion to Strike. That motion explains that the September 1, 2011 newspaper article that the Commission struck from Exhibit I was also placed in evidence by another witness as a part of Exhibit M. Ameren Missouri asks the Commission to strike the article from Exhibit M as well.

The newspaper article in Exhibit M is the same article that the Commission struck from Exhibit I as hearsay. The second copy of the newspaper article must also be struck.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Ameren Missouri's objection to a document received into evidence at the local public hearings is sustained and the following document is struck from evidence:

Newspaper article entitled "Leaks from Ameren toxic waste pond in Labadie stir fears."

2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
