ORDER SUSPENDING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE AND EXTENDING RESPONSE TIME

The hearing on this matter is currently scheduled to begin on April 28, 2014. On April 23, Kansas City Power & Light Company filed a motion asking the Commission to indefinitely suspend the procedural schedule pending further settlement discussions. The parties continue to negotiate and request additional time to determine if it will be possible to resolve this matter without a hearing.

KCP&L also requests that the Commission waive the provision in 4 CSR 240-2.115(2)(B) that requires objections to the April 17 non-unanimous stipulation and agreement to be filed within seven days. The motion asks that the objection period be tolled until a new stipulation and agreement is filed, or, if negotiations fail, until KCP&L requests new hearing dates.

The motion represents that most of the parties have indicated they do not oppose this motion. The other parties have not taken a position.

The Commission finds that KCP&L's motion is reasonable and will grant that motion.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

 Kansas City Power & Light Company's Motion to Suspend Procedural Schedule and Motion for Expedited Treatment is granted.

- 2. The hearing scheduled for April 28 and 29, 2014, is canceled.
- 3. The provision of 4 CSR 240-2.115(2)(B) that requires objections to the April 17, 2014 non-unanimous stipulation and agreement to be filed by April 24, 2014, is waived. The running of the time for objection is tolled until a new stipulation and agreement is filed and ruled upon by the Commission, or, if no new stipulation and agreement is filed and ruled upon, until seven days after KCP&L requests new hearing dates.
 - 4. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
