## ORDER GRANTING APPLICATIONS TO INTERVENE

On May 28, 2013, Ameren Missouri filed its 2013-2015 Annual Renewable Energy Standard Compliance Plan and Report pursuant to Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-20.100. On June 4, Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers filed an application to intervene. Renew Missouri also filed an application to intervene on June 5.<sup>1</sup>

MIEC pleads that as the representative of large industrial customers of Ameren Missouri it has an interest different from that of the general public that may be adversely affected by a final order in this file. Renew Missouri states that its mission includes the promotion of renewable energy in Missouri and that, as such, it also has an interest different from that of the general public that may be adversely affected by a final order in this file.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(15) allows parties ten days to respond to motions. No party objected to the applications. Therefore, the Commission will take them up unopposed.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4) allows the Commission to grant intervention to a person who has an interest different from that of the general public and

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

which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case, or if granting intervention would serve the public interest. Upon review of the unopposed applications, the Commission finds that MIEC and Renew Missouri meet the standard in Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4). Therefore, the Commission will grant the applications to intervene.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The applications to intervene filed by Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers and Renew Missouri are granted.
2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
