Dear Commissioners:

I am writing to you concerning the ongoing issue of approval of the Ameren Missouri MEEIA 2016-2018 program filing. The current program "BizSavers" from Ameren is set to expire November 30th, 2015 and if there is a disruption in the continuation of the program after the expiration date it could be detrimental to our business, our customer's businesses and the overall efficiency of Ameren Missouri's commercial customers.

In June of 2015 I attended a PSC agenda meeting with other energy efficiency businesses form the St. Louis, MO area to ask the commission to consider a statewide collaborative on energy efficiency. While I still believe that this needs to happen soon, I don't believe that it should stop the progress of current approval to extend the BizSavers program. We utilize the program on a daily basis to help get our customers to increase energy efficiency in their businesses.

It is my opinion that if the BizSavers program is delayed going into the next program year it will negatively affect the adoption and utilization of the program. In the past when there have been gaps in program offering it has been very difficult to get customers back on track with efficiency. Delay creates misinformation and rumors in the marketplace that the program has been cancelled, run out of funding, and a general uneasiness for customers to believe in, or adopt the program benefits.

My hope is that the PSC will continue to evaluate include all current stakeholders as well as energy efficiency businesses in the future of the MEEIA program process and filings, but please do not delay the current process of the BizSavers program.

I look forward to making Missouri more efficient with the continuation of the incentive programs.
