ORDER APPROVING STIPULATION AND AGREEMENT

Issue Date: July 20, 2017 Effective Date: July 29, 2017

Background

On June 29, 2016, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri ("Ameren Missouri"), the Staff of the Commission ("Staff"), the Office of Public Counsel ("OPC"), the Department of Economic Development – Division of Energy ("DE"), and Renew Missouri Advocates d/b/a Renew Missouri ("Renew Missouri")(collectively, "the Signatories") filed a Stipulation and Agreement ("the Stipulation") Regarding Cycle 2 Transition Plan for Certain Long-Lead Projects Under the MEEIA Cycle 2 Program. The Stipulation establishes the Signatories' agreement on a process for long-lead energy efficiency projects' implementation and completion, impact measurement and verification, and demand-side programs investment mechanism treatment.

The Signatories filed the Stipulation in accordance with the Commission's February 10, 2016 order approving Ameren Missouri's Cycle 2 MEEIA Plan ("Cycle 2

Order"). The Cycle 2 Order required Ameren Missouri to propose a transition plan between MEEIA cycles, and required any transition plan to receive Commission approval.

The Stipulation

The transition plan embodied in the Stipulation is limited to certain BizSavers programs. The Stipulation is expected to result in overall benefits for Ameren Missouri and for all of its non-residential customers who have not been approved for opt-out of participation in MEEIA programs.

Energy and demand savings targets and program budgets for MEEIA Cycle 2 will not change due to long-lead projects. The total amount of all program costs for all long-lead projects is capped at \$4 million.

All program costs and throughput disincentive associated with long-lead projects' energy and demand savings for all completed long-lead projects will be included in the Program Cost Reconciliation and throughput disincentive reconciliation in keeping with the express terms of the Cycle 2 Rider EEIC. Any additional earnings opportunity impacts associated with long-lead projects will also be included in the calculations in keeping with the express terms of the Cycle 2 Rider EEIC.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.115(2) allows parties to file non-unanimous stipulations and agreements. That same rule allows parties seven days to object, and allows the Commission to treat the non-unanimous stipulation as unanimous if no party timely objects. Seven days have elapsed since the Signatories filed the Stipulation, and no party has objected. Thus, the Commission will treat the Stipulation as unanimous.

The Commission has independently reviewed the Stipulation. The Commission finds the Stipulation to be reasonable, and will approve it.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- The Stipulation and Agreement Regarding Cycle 2 Transition Plan for Certain Long-Lead Projects Under the MEEIA Cycle 2 Program is approved, and its Signatories are ordered to abide by its' terms.
 - 2. This order shall become effective on July 29, 2017.
 - 3. This file shall be closed on July 30, 2017.
