## ORDER MODIFYING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Issue Date: August 26, 2019 Effective Date: August 26, 2019

KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (GMO) has filed an application asking the Commission to approve a special incremental load rate for a steel production facility in Sedalia, Missouri. The procedural schedule established to consider that application provides that rebuttal testimony is to be filed by the parties on August 27, 2019. On August 26, GMO and the Staff of the Commission filed a motion asking that the filing of rebuttal testimony be delayed until August 30.

The motion explains that the parties will be meeting on August 28 for a settlement conference. They ask that the filing of rebuttal testimony be delayed until after the conference to allow the parties to prepare for the conference. If the settlement conference results in progress toward settlement, the parties will file a further request to modify the entire procedural schedule. If progress toward a settlement is not made, the parties will file their rebuttal testimony on August 30.

The Commission finds the motion to delay the filing of rebuttal testimony reasonable. It will be granted. No other aspect of the procedural schedule will be modified at this time.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Motion to Modify Procedural Schedule is granted.

- 2. The procedural schedule is modified to provide that the parties shall file rebuttal testimony no later than August 30, 2019.
  - 3. This order shall be effective when issued.
