## ORDER SETTING TIME FOR RESPONSES

On June 4, 2021, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri, the Staff of the Commission, and the Office of the Public Counsel (collectively referred to as "Signatories") filed a *Stipulation and Agreement Regarding Funding for Residential Heating and Cooling Programs*. The agreement provides that an additional \$5 million may be added to the 5% budget contingency for the Residential Heating and Cooling Program. The Residential Heating and Cooling Program provides incentives for heating and cooling products such as HVAC units through Ameren Missouri's Missouri Energy Efficiency and Investment Act (MEEIA) plan.

Although the Signatories stated that all the non-signatory parties indicate they do not oppose approval of the agreement, Commission Rule 4 CSR 4240-2.115(2)(B) gives each party seven days to file an objection to a non-unanimous agreement. Therefore, in accordance with the rule, the Commission sets out the time for filing any responses or objections to the agreement.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. Any objections or responses to the *Stipulation and Agreement Regarding Funding for Residential Heating and Cooling Programs* shall be filed no later than June 11, 2021.
2. This order is effective when issued.
