2	JUDGE STEARLEY: Good morning. It is
3	Monday, March 12, 2012. The Commission has set this time
4	for a prehearing conference in File No. EO-2012-0206, which
5	is captioned as In the Matter of The Empire District
6	Electric Company's Application Concerning Demand-Side
7	Programs and a Demand-Side Program Investment Mechanism.
8	My name is Harold Stearley, and I'm the
9	regulatory law judge presiding over this morning's
10	conference. And we'll begin by taking entries of
11	appearance, starting with The Empire District Electric
12	Company.
13	MS. CARTER: Diana Carter and Dean Cooper,
14	Brydon, Swearengen & England, P.C., address is on file,
15	appearing for The Empire District Electric Company.
16	JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Ms. Carter.
17	For Ameren Missouri.
18	MR. LOWERY: Thank you, your Honor. Jim
19	Lowery, Smith Lewis, LLP, P.O. Box 918, Columbia, Missouri
20	65205, appearing on behalf of Union Electric Company.
21	JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Thank you,
22	Mr. Lowery.
23	For the Missouri Department of Natural
24	Resources.
25	MR. MCMANUS: Jack McManus with the Attorney

- General's Office. I will not be the regular attorney on
- 2 here though. It will be Danny Fraser.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Thank you very
- 4 much.
- 5 For Wal-Mart stores and Sam's East,
- 6 Incorporated.
- 7 MR. WOODSMALL: Thank you, your Honor.
- 8 Appearing on behalf of Wal-Mart, David Woodsmall. I
- 9 previously provided my address to the court reporter.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Thank you,
- 11 Mr. Woodsmall.
- 12 The Missouri Industrial Energy Association.
- 13 All right. Let the record reflect there's no entry at this
- 14 time, though we did have a little trouble with our phone
- 15 bridge. Mr. Conrad may be calling in.
- 16 For the Staff of the Missouri Public Service
- 17 Commission.
- 18 MS. SLACK: Annette Slack for Staff of
- 19 Missouri Public Service Commission.
- MR. BORGMEYER: And John Borgmeyer.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Ms. Slack,
- Mr. Borgmeyer.
- 23 For the Office of the Public Counsel.
- 24 MR. MILLS: Lewis Mills. My address is
- P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, appearing

- for the Office of the Public Counsel and the public.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Thank you very
- 3 much, Mr. Mills.
- 4 I did issue an Order this morning granting
- 5 Request for Intervention. Did want to make one note: Is
- 6 someone here from Renew Missouri this morning? We had an
- 7 EIFS notification for an Application to Intervene by Renew
- 8 Missouri, but there was no attached application. So at
- 9 this point their application for intervention has not been
- 10 granted. I'm assuming we will be getting a document to
- 11 that effect sometime here soon. We'll take it up then.
- 12 Are there any preliminary matters we need to
- 13 address? Hearing none. I know we are on a 120-day
- 14 timeline. With the MIA (ph.) application, the parties, of
- 15 course, are welcome to work out a different procedural
- 16 schedule, something which works out better for them. But
- 17 the deadline for a Commission decision would be June 27th,
- if I'm calculating the date correctly.
- 19 So I would like the parties to file either a
- 20 status report or a procedural schedule by next Monday,
- 21 March 19th. And I did want to advise the parties of my
- 22 conflict dates coming up. As you're preparing your
- 23 procedural schedule, I have conflicts on April 4th, 5th,
- 24 9th, 11th, 12th; May 3rd, 10th, 11th, 16th, 17th, and 31st.
- 25 MS. SLACK: Can you do the May again?

1	JUDGE STEARLEY: Yes. May 3rd, 10th, 11th,
2	16th, 17th, 31st; June 1st, 14th, 15th; July 12th, 13th,
3	26th, 27th; and August 6th through 10th.
4	So I'm not sure where we'll be at, if we're
5	going to make that June 120-day timeline or not, but I
6	wanted to let you know the conflicts that I'm aware of.
7	MS. SLACK: And, Judge, it's our
8	understanding that the other cases have gone out to
9	180 days, so we'll probably like to be filing a motion for
10	additional time to extend out to 180 days.
11	JUDGE STEARLEY: That's fine. As long as
12	all the parties are in agreement, I'll take a look at that
13	motion. You're certainly welcome to have additional time
14	if everyone feels it's necessary.
15	All right. Is there anything else we need
16	to take up on the record? Well, hearing none, we'll
17	conclude the on-the-record portion of this. You guys have
18	the room until noon and the phone bridge until noon if you
19	need it. Thank you all very much.
