Re: Aquila / Harper Power Plant

- Public schools are funded by tax revenue, primarily from property taxes. >
- > Commercial enterprises, such as utilities, are responsible for a large portion of that property tax revenue.
- Aquila's Harper Rd. power plant should pay \$2,167,433 / yr in school taxes. >  $($140,900,000 \times 1/3 \times $4.6445/$100 = $2,167,433)$
- Through a scheme to use bond financing from a governmental entity, Aquila plans to > avoid all property taxation for public schools.
- This is the loss to the fourteen school districts and 18,000 students in Cass County.
- Missouri law specifies that, "... all property owned or even controled by utilities will > be taxed ... " (RSMo 153.030)
- Aquila's Harper Rd. power plant must **MUST NOT AVOID TAXATION!**
- Property taxation is the mechanism established to provide the basic governmental > service of public education. Approval of a power plant that avoids property taxation should not be allowed.
