ORDER WAIVING NOTICE OF INTENT

The Missouri Public Service Commission is granting any necessary waiver of the notice of intent requirement because the applicant has shown good cause. The applicant requested a waiver ("motion") as part of the application.¹ No party has filed a response within the time provided by regulation.²

In the motion, the applicant seeks a waiver of the notice of intent requirement under 4 CSR 240-4.020(2) ("regulation"):

Any regulated entity that intends to file a case likely to be a contested case shall file a notice with the secretary of the commission a minimum of sixty (60) days prior to filing such case. Such notice shall detail the type of case and issues likely to be before the commission.

(A) Any case filed which is not in compliance with this section shall not be permitted and the secretary of the commission shall reject any such filing.

(B) A party may request a waiver of this section for good cause.

Good cause means a good faith request for reasonable relief. 3

In support of the motion, the applicant alleges that a 60-day waiting period before filing the application would interfere with the project described in the application. That allegation has evidentiary support in the affidavit accompanying the application. No party has disputed the applicant's allegations of good cause, contested the grant of a waiver, or sought relief based on the regulation. The applicant has shown good cause for a waiver. Therefore, the Commission will grant the motion.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The request for waiver is granted.
- 2. Any notice of intent requirement under 4 CSR 240-4.020(2) is waived.
- 3. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
