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1 PROCEEDINGS
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- JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Let's go ahead and
- 3 get started. We're here today for a conference in the
- 4 Case No. EO-2006-0240, which concerns Union Electric
- 5 Company's utility resource filing requirement.
- 6 And we'll begin today by taking entries of
- 7 appearance beginning with AmerenUE.
- 8 MR. BYRNE: Thank you, your Honor. My name is
- 9 Tom Byrne, and my address is 1901 Cheauteau Avenue, St.
- 10 Louis, Missouri, 63103. And I'm representing AmerenUE.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And for Staff?
- 12 MR. DOTTHEIM: Steven Dottheim, Post Office Box
- 13 360, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102, appearing on behalf
- 14 of the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission.
- 15 JUDGE WOODRUFF: And for the Office of Public
- 16 Counsel?
- 17 MR. MILLS: On behalf of the Office of Public
- 18 Counsel, my name is Lewis Mills. My address is Post
- 19 Office Box 2230 in Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102.
- 20 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you. And for the Sierra
- 21 Club?
- MR. ROBERTSON: Henry Robertson. Do I need to
- 23 repeat the address?
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: No.
- MR. ROBERTSON: Okay.

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1 JUDGE WOODRUFF: And for the Department of
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- 2 Natural Resources?
- 3 MS. WOODS: Shelley Ann Woods, Post Office Box
- 4 898, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102, appearing on behalf
- 5 of the Missouri Department of Natural Resources.
- 6 JUDGE WOODRUFF: For the Missouri Industrial
- 7 Energy Consumers?
- 8 MR. BRUBAKER: Judge, MIEC is not represented by
- 9 counsel today. I'm Morris Brubaker, a consultant at MIEC,
- 10 just monitoring.
- 11 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you. And for Missouri
- 12 Energy Group? No one. And for Noranda Aluminum?
- MR. DOTTHEIM: Mr. -- Judge Woodruff?
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Go ahead.
- 15 MR. DOTTHEIM: I believe -- because I know I've
- 16 received a phone call from him on his cell phone a little
- 17 earlier this morning, Mr. Conrad for Noranda Aluminum,
- 18 Inc., is intending to be in attendance this morning, was
- 19 planning on being here by now. I expect he should be here
- 20 very shortly.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Well, thank you.
- 22 We'll go ahead and -- which when comes, he can, of course,
- 23 participate.
- 24 All right. I believe that's all the parties. I
- 25 asked to schedule this conference essentially so that the

- 1 parties could give the Commission advice on where we want
- 2 to proceed from here. The regulation indicates that the
- 3 Commission, I believe it says, may schedule a hearing if
- 4 it wishes to do so, and I'm asking the parties whether the
- 5 Commission needs to conduct a hearing.
- 6 On the -- as the other alternative, can the
- 7 Commission issue an order based on the existing record or
- 8 if there's any additional information that you want to put
- 9 in the record, let me know. I'll ask you to give me
- 10 written recommendations by a week from today, the 17th.
- 11 If you can reach an agreement today, that would
- 12 be great. If you can't reach an agreement, you can file
- 13 competing recommendations, and the Commission will decide
- 14 between them.
- 15 Is there anything else anyone wants to bring up
- 16 while we're on the record?
- 17 MR. MILLS: The -- and recommendations in the
- 18 event that at least some of us want to recommend a
- 19 hearing, would you expect a proposed procedural schedule,
- 20 prefiled testimony, the whole nine yards?
- 21 JUDGE WOODRUFF: I would expect a proposed
- 22 procedural schedule. Whether or not you need prefiled
- 23 testimony and so forth, make your recommendation, and the
- 24 Commission will consider it.
- 25 As you are all no doubt aware, the Commission's

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1 schedule is very crowded in the next few months, so --
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- 2 MR. DOTTHEIM: Judge, it might -- Mr. Mills has
- 3 broached the subject. It might expedite matters if -- if
- 4 the parties -- in particular, the parties that were
- 5 interested in -- in a hearing would propose with the
- 6 procedural schedule how they would propose to proceed with
- 7 prefiled testimony, who would file first, how many rounds
- 8 of testimony and -- and maybe, too, frankly, if they are
- 9 going to suggest a hearing even taking a look at the
- 10 Commission's schedule and even suggesting dates because,
- 11 as you've indicated, the -- the schedule is -- is quite --
- 12 is quite congested.
- 13 And I don't know even how that might impact
- 14 various parties' perspective. That is, if -- if there is
- 15 not a chance of hearings in the immediate future, the --
- 16 the hearings would have to be several months off whether,
- 17 as a consequence, they might be more inclined to proceed
- 18 by paper than -- than actually convening an evidentiary
- 19 hearing for cross examination.
- 20 But I -- I certainly won't seek to speak on
- 21 behalf of -- of -- of any other party. I just tossed
- 22 those -- those matters out in particular, again, if -- if
- 23 parties are seeking trying to -- to expedite this case as
- 24 quickly as possible at this point.
- 25 JUDGE WOODRUFF: This is Judge Woodruff again.

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1 And I will add that the Commission, for the first time, is
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- 2 starting to double-book hearings.
- 3 MS. WOODS: Oh, my.
- 4 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Which means that we have two
- 5 hearing rooms, and we will probably be using both of them.
- 6 So double-booking is a possibility.
- 7 Anything else anyone wants to bring up while
- 8 we're on the record? All right. With that, then, the
- 9 on-the-record portion of this proceeding is adjourned.
- 10 And I'll leave you to your discussions. Thank you all
- 11 very much.
- MS. WOODS: Thank you.
- MR. BYRNE: Thank you, Judge.
- MR. ROBERTSON: Thank you, Judge.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: We're off the record.

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
