**ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO EXTEND TIME TO FILE TARIFF**

In a stipulation and agreement approved in Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri's most recent rate case, Ameren Missouri was required to file a Standby Tariff no later than December 31, 2015, unless the signatories to the stipulation and agreement collectively agree that more time is necessary. On December 28, Ameren Missouri filed a motion explaining that the signatories have been collaborating in drafting the Standby Tariff, but now agree that an extra month is needed to complete and file the tariff. For that reason, the motion asks the Commission to extend the time to file the tariff until January 31, 2016.

The motion represents that Ameren Missouri has discussed this proposed extension with counsel for Staff, MIEC, and the Division of Energy, and that they do not object to the request for additional time. Furthermore, more than ten days have passed since Ameren Missouri filed its motion and no party has responded to that motion.<sup>1</sup>

The Commission finds that Ameren Missouri's request for more time to file its tariff is reasonable and will grant that motion.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri's Motion for Extension of Time to File Tariff is granted.
2. Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri shall file its Standby Tariff no later than January 31, 2016.
3. This order shall be effective when issued.
