On July 16, 2009, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a motion to cancel the voice over Internet protocol registration of DIECA Communications, Inc., d/b/a Covad Communications Company. Staff filed the motion with the Missouri Public Service Commission in response to an application for the discontinuance of service that Covad submitted to the Federal Communications Commission.

On August 7, 2009, Covad filed its *Response Opposing Staff's Motion To Cancel VoIP Service* which clarified only one office in Missouri would be affected. In addition Covad stated they intend to continue providing broadband and VoIP services in Missouri.

On August 19, 2009, Staff filed a voluntary withdrawal of its July 16 Motion based on Covad's August 7 response and clarification.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.116(1) permits an applicant to voluntarily dismiss its application without an order of the Commission at any time before prepared testimony has been filed or oral evidence has been offered. No

prepared testimony or oral evidence has been offered in this case. Therefore, the Commission acknowledges that Staff has withdrawn its application.

- 1. Staff's Motion To Cancel VoIP Registration of DIECA Communications, Inc., d/b/a Covad Communications Company is withdrawn.
