AFFIDAVIT OF RENEE' REETER IN SUPPORT OF RESPONDENTS' MOTION FOR SUMMARY DETERMINATION

Affiant, Renee' Reeter, being duly sworn deposes and states:

- 1. My name is Renee' Reeter. I am over the age of twenty-one, and I am of sound mind.
- 2. I am the Controller of Green Hills Telecommunications Services ("Company") and have held that position since October 25, 1999. I am familiar with the dispute between the Company and T-Mobile, and I am familiar with the Company's network connections with other carriers. I have access to the records and information related to T-Mobile's network connections and past due billings. Based on my knowledge of these records and information, I have knowledge of the facts contained herein, and I am competent to testify on these matters.

T-MOBILE TRAFFIC AND PAST DUE BILLS

3. T-Mobile f/k/a VoiceStream delivered wireless calls to Company's exchanges during the time period at issue in this case (i.e. between the March 13, 2002 effective date of Company's wireless termination service tariff and April 29, 2005).

- 4. T-Mobile did not have a Commission-approved agreement with the Company at any point during the time period at issue in this case. Nor does T-Mobile presently have a Commission-approved agreement with the Company.
- 5. The Company has never agreed to a "bill-and-keep" arrangement or agreement with T-Mobile.
- 6. The Company has had wireless termination service tariffs and intrastate exchange access tariffs in place and in effect during the time period at issue in this case.
- 7. The Company has sent bills to T-Mobile for service under the Company's tariffs, but T-Mobile has repeatedly refused to pay those invoices.

BLOCKING AND THE MISSOURI LEC-TO-LEC NETWORK

- 8. The Missouri local exchange carrier ("LEC-to-LEC") network is one of several different ways to deliver telecommunications traffic to the Company's rural exchanges.
- 9. If an originating carrier's traffic is blocked over the LEC-to-LEC network, then the originating carrier has other options to deliver that traffic to the same destination. For example, traffic could be delivered over the interexchange carrier ("IXC" or "long distance") network.
- 10. Thus, blocking over the LEC-to-LEC network only prevents T-Mobile from using one of several network connections available to deliver calls to the Company.

 Blocking over the LEC-to-LEC network does not prevent T-Mobile from delivering calls to the Company's exchanges over other network connections.
