## **SECOND AMENDED APPLICATION**

COMES NOW Kansas City Power & Light Company ("KCP&L") pursuant to Section 393.170 RSMo and 4 CSR 240-2.060 and for its Second Amended Application to the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") states:

- 1. KCP&L is a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Missouri, with its principal office at 1201 Walnut, Kansas City, Missouri 64106.
- 2. KCP&L holds Certificates of Convenience and Necessity from the Commission to transact business as an electric public utility in certain areas of the State of Missouri and is principally engaged in the generation, transmission, distribution and sale of electric power and energy.

- 4. KCP&L has heretofore filed with this Commission a certified copy of the Articles of Consolidation under which it was organized and of all amendments thereto.
- 5. Authority is sought and KCP&L is requesting that the Commission issue a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to permit KCP&L to extend a portion of a 69 kV transmission line and construct and operate a substation in territory served by Aquila, Inc. ("Aquila") in Clay County, Missouri.
- 6. Attached hereto as Schedule A, is a copy of Drawing 59/442S/A01-001 that shows the proposed extension of said transmission line and that portion of the territory in which Aquila provides service and through which the line runs.
- 7. Attached hereto as Schedule B is a description of the route of the construction of said 69 kV transmission line.
- 8. Attached hereto as Schedule C, is a copy of Drawing 59/442S/A01-002 that shows the area where the transmission line and electrical substation will be located.
- 9. Attached hereto as Schedule D is a description of the area where KCP&L's substation will be located.
- 10. KCP&L seeks to extend the transmission line parallel and east of the Rock Island Railroad right-of-way to comply with Amendatory Agreement No. 2 to Multiple Interconnection Transmission Contract, Interconnection Schedule No. 15, Liberty South 161 kV.

- 11. Extending the transmission line will be undertaken in conjunction with construction of the new Liberty South Substation. KCP&L will own and operate a 161-69 kV substation facility within the Aquila substation.
- 12. There are no alternative routes which are as or more efficient than the requested route of the transmission line.
- 13. The extension of the transmission line and construction of the substation facilities will be financed from current funds. The total estimated cost of the transmission line extension is \$222,000. The total estimated cost of the substation facilities is \$1,573,000.
- 14. The 69 kV transmission line is proposed as three-phase, double circuit, of single steel pole construction; the conductor wire of which shall be 397.5 MCM-ACSR-26/7, and the shield wire which shall be a single 3/8 seven strand extra high strength galvanized wire.
- 15. There are no electric and telephone lines of regulated and non-regulated utilities, railroad tracks or any underground facility as defined in Section 319.015 RSMo, which the proposed transmission line will cross.
- 16. Aquila is aware of KCP&L's proposal to extend the transmission line and construct the substation and has no objection to KCP&L's application or construction of said facilities.
- 17. KCPL has performed a load study to analyze the impact of load growth in areas served by KCPL's 69 kV system in the Kansas City metropolitan area. The new Liberty South Substation and the new 69 kV transmission line serving this substation will provide a source of power closer to the areas experiencing load growth.

WHEREFORE, KCP&L requests that the Commission issue a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity authorizing KCP&L to construct, own, operate and maintain a 69 kV transmission

line and substation in a portion of Aquila's service territory in Clay County, Missouri, as described in this Application.


