ORDER REVISING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

An evidentiary hearing is scheduled for this case on October 15-17, 2013. On September 19, Labadie Environmental Organization (LEO) and the Sierra Club filed a motion asking the Commission to postpone the hearing until November 12-14 to allow the parties more time to review the extensive surrebuttal testimony that was filed on September 13. The Commission established September 25 as the deadline to respond to LEO and Sierra Club's motion. On September 23, Ameren Missouri filed a response indicating its willingness to postpone the hearing. No other party responded to LEO and Sierra Club's motion.

The Commission will postpone the hearing as requested. The existing procedural schedule requires the parties to file a list of issues on September 30 and statements of position on October 7. The Commission will delay these other procedural events to match the rescheduled hearing dates.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

All other requirements established in the Commission's March 19, 2013 Order Adopting Procedural Schedule remain in effect.
